Scott Turner in his official capacity as Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, et. al</i>  <b>The City of San Diego filed an amended complaint, along with nearly seventy localities across the country, against the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), challenging the federal administration's imposition of new grant conditions for the City's awarded and anticipated federal grants. These grants support a wide range of essential local programs, including affordable housing, rental assistance, and homeless services. They also support long-term capital improvement projects like bridge rehabilitation and street repairs; improve libraries, parks, and community centers; and expand clean energy efforts such as mobile EV charging for zero emission vehicles.
