- Patrons must check in with staff before starting a print.
- Patrons are expected to bring in their own materials and follow the materials guidelines:
 - Proofgrade materials highly recommended. Proofgrade materials are made by Glowforge for the Glowforge and takes the guesswork out of your work.
 - Non-Proofgrade materials must be cleared with staff.
 Materials must be compatible with a CO2 laser. Patrons must provide a receipt or tag that states what the item is made of.
 We reserve the right to refuse materials we are uncertain of or deem to be unsafe. Please review the prohibited materials list and examples of acceptable materials, prior to your visit.
- Two (2) hour maximum run time for a print. Longer projects may be required to be broken up into smaller sessions.
- Prints need to be finished before the IDEA Lab closes.
- Patrons must monitor the printing of their project for the entirety of the process. Press the button to pause if you need to step away.

- Wood (Unstained, untreated, unpainted, no glues)
- Cast acrylic
- Cardboard (No glues)
- Natural leather (not pleather or faux leather; or treated with chemicals)

Prohibited Materials:

- PVC Emits chlorine gas when cut
- ABS Emits cyanide gas and melts
- Vinyl Emits chlorine gas when cut
- Metals Machine not strong enough to cut
- Resin Emits fumes
- Fiberglass Emits fumes
- Artificial leather/vinyl Emits chlorine gas
- Stained, painted, or treated woods
- Plywoods with incompatible glues
- Extruded acrylic Emits strong odor
- PolySytrene Foam
- Epoxy
- Corian
- Delrin
- Food
