# Proposed Adjustments to Water and Wastewater Rates Will Be Considered at an Upcoming Public Hearing

This notice explains:

- What is being proposed and why
- How your rates would change and when
- The decision-making process and how you can protest or object to the adjustments

Rate adjustments are needed from time to time to pay for increased costs to run the City of San Diego's water and wastewater systems. As a public agency, the City cannot earn a profit from the services it provides and may not charge more than the costs associated with providing services to its customers.

### **Estimated Monthly Increases From Proposed Rates**

The amounts below show the typical anticipated single-family monthly bill increase in the City of San Diego. Your rates depend on the size of your water meter, the type of property and other variables.

# Why are Water and Wastewater Fees Increasing?

The City's Public Utilities Department (PUD) provides reliable water and wastewater service cost-effectively while protecting public health and resources. PUD does not generate a profit and is not supported by the City's General Fund. The rates charged for water and wastewater service must be directly tied to the actual cost of providing that service. While PUD strives to keep costs low, it purchases 85–90% of our drinking water from the San Diego County Water Authority (SDCWA), which imposes yearly wholesale rate increases. The City must also invest in infrastructure rehabilitation and replacement to maintain reliable, compliant service. Debt is issued for these improvements, spreading costs over time. A recent independent cost of service study found that without rate adjustments, revenue will fall short between FY 2026–2030. To avoid high emergency repair costs and service disruptions, PUD focuses on strategic maintenance and prioritizes capital projects by risk. Infrastructure investment enhances system reliability and reduces the risk of water main breaks and overflows. Without the proposed rate increases, deeper budget cuts would be needed—raising the likelihood of system failures, environmental damage and regulatory penalties.




# Where Does the Money Go that the City Collects from Water and Wastewater Fees?

Water and wastewater fees help San Diego provide clean water and reliable wastewater services. Rising costs, especially for purchasing water from SDCWA, are the main reason for proposed rate increases. Additional funds support water storage, treatment and distribution, system operations and maintenance, and infrastructure. These investments are vital to serve 1.4 million residents and safely treat wastewater for 2.3 million people in the region.

### **How to Protest or Object**

You may speak at the public hearing, but protests and objections must be made in writing (see below). Objections will be responded to in writing before the public hearing. Protests and objections, as explained below, are two different processes, and have two different purposes. You may file both a protest and legal objection, however, they must be submitted separately.

All written objections must be submitted to the City within the written objection period. Failure to timely object in writing bars any right to challenge that fee or assessment through a legal proceeding. Under Government Code Section 53759 there is a 120-day statute of limitations for challenging any new, increased, or extended water and sewer fee or charge. Any judicial action or proceeding to challenge the resolution adopting the proposed fees or charges must be commenced within 120 days of the effective date or of the date of the final passage, adoption, or approval of the resolution, whichever is later.

### **Public Hearing Information**

A public hearing will be held on proposed maximum increases to water and wastewater rates and pass-through charges in calendar years 2026 through 2029.

The City Council will hear and consider oral testimony and written materials submitted regarding the proposed rate increases at the hearing. The City Council will have the authority to make adjustments to the proposed rate increases in response to oral testimony and written materials submitted for consideration. Only formal written protests will be considered under the City's Proposition 218 protest tabulating procedures and must be received before the close of the public hearing either in person at the public hearing or via mail to:

Per state law, the public hearing will be televised on City TV and simulcast on the City's website at **sandiego.gov/citytv**. More information about Council meeting access and public comment is available online at **sandiego.gov/cc**.

Oral comments at the public hearing will be considered by the City Council but will not qualify as formal protests unless accompanied by a written protest. If, at the close of the public hearing, written protests against the rate increase are not presented by a majority of property owners or ratepayers, the City Council will consider and may adopt a resolution authorizing the proposed rate increases. If approved, the proposed adjustments will first appear on bills for the billing period beginning in January 2026.

This notice is being provided to you by the City of San Diego Public Utilities Department pursuant to California Constitution Article XIII D (also known as "Proposition 218"). Under the terms of Proposition 218, the City is required to notify the property owners of record of proposed changes to property-related fees, such as water and wastewater. This serves as notice that the City Council will conduct a public hearing, at the time, date and location specified above, to consider recommended adjustments to the City's water and wastewater service rates and charges. Only one protest per parcel is permitted.
