  - 1. Potential Termination by the City of San Diego of the Open Space Easement Grant Deed on the Polo Fields

Several community members spoke in opposition of the potential termination of the open space easement grant deed. None spoke in favor.

Adam Fox motioned that the planning board authorizes the Chairperson to write a letter in strong opposition to the potential termination of the open space easement grant deed, noting that the public comment is unanimously opposed, that the city's proposed action in closed door session violates the public trust and restricts public access to open space as contemplated in the city plan. The planning board requests that the city engage the Carmel Valley Community Planning Board and the community at large before making any decisions on this matter. Greg Hodosevich seconded. Motion passed 9-0.

2. Infrastructure Priorities: The City Planning Department is asking planning groups to submit priorities for infrastructure projects and improvements for the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The Board discussed and made recommendations on which projects should be prioritized.

Applicant: Chair, Carmel Valley Community Planning Board

Greg Hodosevich made a motion to add a new dam at Lake Hodges and a garbage processing plant at Miramar to our CIP list. Motioned was not seconded. Motion failed.

Chair Strauss placed three projects into the city's request form:

- Improvements to Carmel Valley Library
- Traffic calming around the Village at Pacific Highlands Ranch
- Traffic calming at the intersection of Pacific Highlands Ranch Parkway and Blue Dawn Trail

Allen Kashani motioned to support the three projects as listed and ask the city for clarification on whether existing CIPs should be added; if so, they will be attached to the new project request. Seconded by Jeffrey Heden. Motion passed 9-0.

3. Discussion and Potential Action on California SB 79: Jeffrey Heden motions to authorize the Chair to write a letter stating that the Carmel Valley Planning Board supports the CPC letter opposing SB 79 in its current draft. While recognizing the housing shortage in Southern California, we believe that San Diego is better served by conventional local planning. The group further opposes the 20-year time horizon and determining density based on transit that does not yet exist. Seconded by Greg Hodosevich. Motion passes 8-1.
