





Barrio Logan is one of San Diego's most culturally vibrant and historically significant neighborhoods.

Have you visited Barrio Logan? Barrio Logan, once part of Logan Heights, became home to many Mexican-American families in the early 1900s. Over time, it grew into a hub of Chicano art, culture, and activism, known for its murals, galleries, shops, and diverse dining. Today, it proudly stands as one of only three official California Cultural Districts in San Diego County, celebrating its vibrant and resilient community. 



Once a teacher, coach, principal, senior director of equity, and deputy superintendent, she now holds San Diego Unified's first ever appointed Latina superintendent position. Public Library



ALL THINGS EBT

CalFresh is a state program that awards one person up to \$292 a month for groceries. Essentially, it's a free debit card for groceries!!



Electronic Benefits Transfer or EBT is an electronic system that allows an individual to receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and to pay for food using SNAP benefits. Cal Fresh is one example of SNAP Benefits.

Are there currently cuts to SNAP benefits?

Legislation passed in Congress on July 3, 2025 has created changes to an individual's SNAP accessibility. This includes stricter work requirements, limitations on future benefit increases, and changes to immigrant eligibility. Although these changes don't go into effect right away, some will not take effect for several years.

As of now, you can keep using your SNAP benefits as usual.







Under the Museums for All program, local cultural institutions offer low-cost or free admission for EBT cardholders (with photo ID).

Can I use my EBT Card at Farmer's Markets?

Many farmers' markets in San Diego participate in Market Match, offering dollar-for-dollar matching when you spend your CalFresh EBT at the market. To find local participating markets and learn more check out this link!





Discounted Amazon Prime membership for SNAP recipients!



Need assistance paying for utilities? EBT members automatically qualify to receive 30% or more off your energy bill each month!



Need assistance paying for Internet Service?
Lifeline is a federal program that lowers the monthly cost of phone or internet service.



Discounted Doordash Pass for SNAP recipients, as well as the ability to order using EBT for participating vendors.

WHAT IS THE YOUTH COMMISSION?

The San Diego Youth
Commission serves as an
advisory body to the Mayor and
City Council.

WHO CAN JOIN?

Anyone between the ages of 14 - 25 years old that lives or goes to school in the City of San Diego, can serve as a youth commissioner.

WHY YOU SHOULD JOIN?

Youth representation and voice is important in City decision making and allocation of resources. Without youth input, how will the people making decisions on behalf of youth know they are making the right decisions?

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF A YOUTH COMMISSIONER?

- Provide advice to City elected officials on issues affecting youth and their communities.
- Amplify youth voices by ensuring they are actively considered in the decision-making process.
- Engage in empowering youth advocacy to shape policies that affect youth lives.
- Build skills and knowledge on public policy, leadership, and gain valuable learning opportunities.
- Participate in community engagement by coming together with like minded & diverse youth who are dedicated to making a positive impact in their City.



WHAT SHOULD YOU PACK FOR COLLEGE?

Heading off to college this fall? Whether you're moving into a dorm or student housing, packing smart is key to starting strong. Here's a detailed list of essentials to help you settle in and feel at home from day one:

Bedding & Sleep Essentials

- Twin XL sheet set (2 sets recommended)
- Comforter or duvet
- 1−2 pillows + pillowcases
- Blanket or throw for naps or cold nights

Academic Supplies

- Laptop or tablet w/ Digital pen (check college recommendations)
- Charging cords & extension cable
- Notebooks, folders, and binders
- Pens, pencils, highlighters, sticky notes
- Backpack or tote bag
- USB drive or external hard drive
- Desk organizer
- Calendar/planner

🤛 Personal Hygiene & Bathroom Item

- Medication (prescriptions or over the counter)
- Shower caddy (portable for shared bathrooms)
- Flip-flops or shower shoes (shower use)
- Towels (2 bath, 2 hand, 1 washcloth)
- Toothbrush, toothpaste, floss
- Shampoo, conditioner, body wash, deodorant
- Razor, shaving cream, hairbrush/comb


