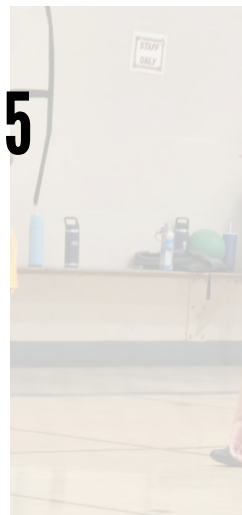

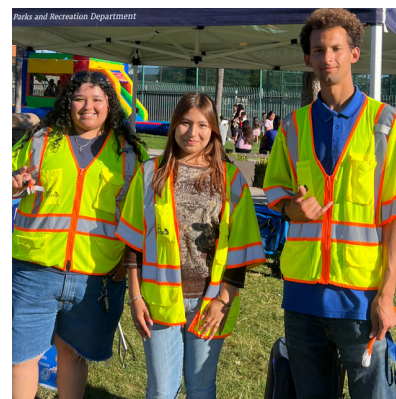

# SAN DIEGO PARKS FOUNDATION

## *Park Ambassadors*



The San Diego Parks Foundation in conjunction with the City of San Diego Parks and Recreation Department finished a very busy summer schedule with the following programs:

- **Parks After Dark** - 99 events completed in 7-weeks with 36,098 community members in attendance. This averaged out to 373 folks visiting events each night. City Heights, Memorial, Linda Vista, Skyline and Silver Wing Recreation Centers all offered meals, desserts, games, crafts, music, cultural activities, rock walls, game trucks, community resource tables, feeding San Diego, free swim, backpack give-a-ways, and much more every night. In addition, 1,715 surveys were completed by Park Ambassadors to evaluate the success of the program. City staff did a fabulous job at each event while engaging with their communities.
- **Nature Camp** -16 camps with 352 campers finished on August 8<sup>th</sup>. Everyone enjoyed two field trips, science, a visit from the Humane Society and outdoor fun.
- Cesar Chavez Community Park - Installation of the retractable backboards completed.
- **Teen Nite 2025** - This program was provided at 10 locations every Friday night from 5-8pm for six weeks. Attendance numbers and survey results are coming shortly.
- **Southcrest Outdoor Court Project** - Started in May 2025 should be completed by the end of the month with six new LED lights, two new basketball standards, and complete repair of the surface and striping.
- **Movies in the Park Enhancements** - 11 completed with 3 remaining. Attendance for the first 11 events was 2,786, an average of 253 per night.

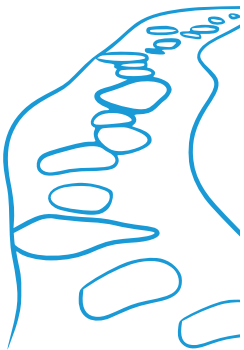

Through a Parks and Recreation Department combined effort from Citywide Playground Repair, Citywide Support Crew, Citywide Irrigation team, Community Parks I grounds maintenance team, and Asset Management team, a potentially hazardous paving condition at Solana Highlands Elementary Joint Use Facility was mitigated prior to the first day of school. Per David Salonijs CPI Grounds Maintenance Supervisor, “the collaboration, sharing of resources, and commitment to efficiency truly made a difference. We not only met but exceeded our goals.”

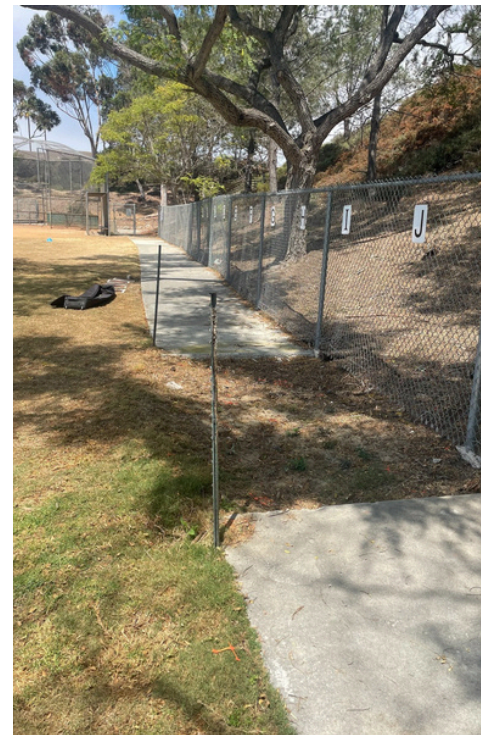
Using in-house staffing and equipment, the team completed the demolition and removal of 280 linear feet of concrete paving that was unsafe and uplifted due to adjacent tree roots. Irrigation in the area was adjusted, and the area was backfilled, regraded, and seeded to reestablish turfgrass. The Environmental Services Department offered support by delivering low-boy dumpsters.

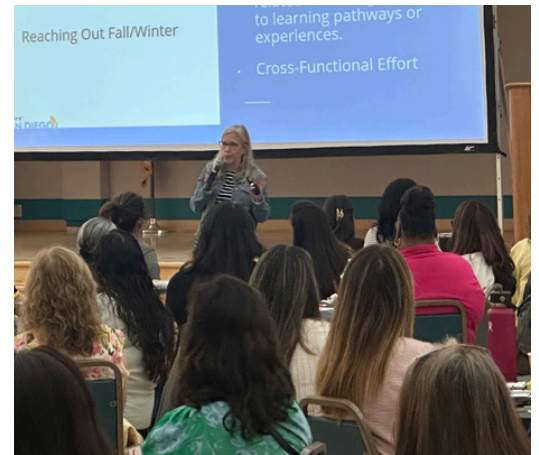




# ANALYST NETWORKING

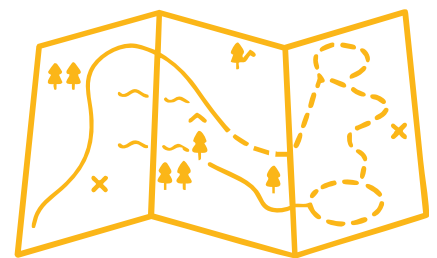
