






Vision Zero within City of San Diego



Historic Severe Injury & Fatality Totals




- Vision Zero \$26.7* million

- Medians (roundabouts) 3 projects: \$1,518,072




Class IV Separated Bikeway

• On average received \$26.7M, need \$185.9M




