Third Person Arrested in Nestor Shooting

San Diego — Two men were killed inside separate camper trailers inside a fenced storage lot in Nestor.

On August 30, 2025, at about 3:25 a.m., San Diego Police Communications received multiple reports of gunfire in the area of 2002 Sunset Avenue, about a mile and a half north of the Mexican border. The property is divided into multiple individually fenced industrial storage lots. Officers responded to the location and found two deceased adult men inside separate camper trailers. The first victim has been identified as 42-year-old Aaron Cruz. The second victim has been identified as 64-year-old Richard Hartung. Both men lived in campers at the location.

With the assistance of city owned and private security cameras, investigators developed information about a possible suspect vehicle, a red Chevy Suburban. Investigators canvased the area and located a similar vehicle. On September 2, at about 12:45 p.m., a traffic stop was conducted on the Suburban in the area of 130 West Calle Primera. The driver was subsequently arrested. He is identified as David Verduzco Kruglova. He is described as a 24-year-old Hispanic man. Kruglova was booked into County Jail on two counts of murder.

On Friday, September 5, 2025, at about 3:53 p.m., a second suspect was taken into custody for the case in the area of 2300 Via Segundo. This person is a 16-year-old male juvenile from Tijuana, Mexico. Due to his age, his name will not be released.

On Friday, September 12, 2024, at about 12:30 p.m., a third suspect was taken into custody for the case in the area of 2300 Via Segundo. He is identified as Marco Ramirez, a 22-year-old male originally from Los Angeles but currently living in Tijuana, Mexico.

Two assault rifles likely used in the shooting have also been recovered.
