Non-Agenda Public Comments: None.

Government Reports:

• Officer James Harris (SDPD):

- Presented crime analysis data based on a three-year average: Crimes against persons (batteries, assaults) in the Western Division are up 2.4%. Property crimes down 19.3%. Society crimes up 15%.
- Discussed specific incidents including a staffing incident at the Salvation Army and a home burglary on the 3000 block of Calypso.
- Announced "Coffee with a Cop" events at local businesses and encouraged suggestions for locations.
- o Addressed questions regarding homeless encampments and the "Get It Done" app for reporting issues.

Randy- Mayor's Office (Emailed - Not Present):

- Serra Mesa Library (3440 Sandrock Road) to be transformed into 59 affordable housing for veterans.
- Mayor sponsors SB 569 to streamline encampment abatement on Caltrans property.
- City of San Diego Invites Residents to Learn More About Proposed Trash and Recycling Services: April 4th Virtual meeting 9:00am-11:00am and April 7 at SD College of Continuing Education at 5:30pm.
- Mayor Gloria and City Council to Host Annual 'Women of Distinction' Ceremony in Honor of Women's History Month.

• Margaret (Councilmember Campbell's Office):

Randy's report covered most of the updates. No additional specific updates were provided.

• Sophie (Regional Airport Authority):

- New Terminal 1 Project (Phase 1A): Approximately 85% complete, on track for late summer opening.
 Wi-Fi being installed, systems being tested. Concessionaires are building out their spaces.
- o Parking Plaza (Stage 2): Approximately 90% complete, set to open in June.
- o Airlines in New Terminal: Southwest, Frontier, Sun Country, Spirit, JetBlue, Elysian, and Breeze.
- Roadway Changes: New on-airport roadway from Laurel Street will take approximately 45,000 vehicles off North Harbor Drive.
- A new Terminal 1 roadshow presentation will be given in July or summer to inform the community about changes. September planned opening.
- Air Service Updates: New non-stop service from San Diego Airport to Panama City with Copa Airlines.
 WestJet extended several services. New daily service to Fresno, California. Lufthansa upgrading San Diego-Munich route with premium cabin offering starting March 30th. Turkish Airlines service to Munich resumes March 1st.

Robson (Assemblymember Tasha Boemer's Office)

- o Addressed concerns about encampments on County property, advising contact with his office.
- Legislative Updates (13 bills introduced):
 - **Density Bonuses:** Clarifies density bonus law to include non-residential projects and short-term vacation rentals (if affordable housing percentage is met).
 - **Affordable Home Internet:** Mandates internet service providers to offer affordable plans to low-income households in California.

- **Toxic Microplastics**: Bans the sale of non-rinse personal care and cleaning products containing plastic microbeads.
- **SB1017:** Focuses on affordability and transparency in SDG&E's rate setting by requiring reporting on distribution capacities.

• Shaina (Congressman Scott Peters' Office):

- Tijuana River Valley: Secured almost \$650 million for repairs and upgrades to the South Bay International Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- NIH Funding: Congressman Peters highlighted the importance of NIH funding by bringing Dr. James Brewer from UCSD to the President's State of the Union address.

• Dina (Naval Base Point Loma):

- No updates on NAVWAR revitalization; environmental document in production.
- Increased traffic due to federal civilians returning to in-person work. Transportation fairs will be held in early April to promote ride-sharing and public transit.
- The F18 jet crash on February 12th is still under investigation. Both occupants are safe. Environmental team deployed a boom system to contain spillage, and recovery efforts for the jet are complete.

Jim (MCRD):

- Operations continue as normal despite the federal government hiring freeze and lack of FY25 budget.
- Recruitment and training of Marines continue; on track to meet mission this year and have a larger starting pool next year.
- o Increased activity expected in the summer with more graduations, bringing visitors to the area.

Information Items-

San Diego Aquatic Center Presentation:

Stephen Rodie, President of the San Diego Aquatic Center Council, presented on the proposed aquatic center at the former Naval Training Center site.

- The master plan for the NTC closure included an aquatic center for the region.
- The recently burned Building 619 was in disrepair and limited the site's capacity.
- Advocates for a multi-pool facility to serve diverse groups simultaneously, including teaching swimming, competitive practices, and community use.
- Highlighted the ideal waterfront location for a world-class facility.
- A multi-pool facility would drive economic impact through large-scale competitions, tourism (elite and collegiate teams), and local school use.
- Proposed a design with multiple 50-meter pools, a shallower community pool, and movable bulkheads to maximize water use.
- Expressed the need for an economic impact report to assess revenue generation, noting current city pools
 operate in the red.
- Anticipates a public-private partnership for funding, with strong interest from stakeholders like Point Loma Nazarene University.
- Envisions the center providing opportunities for all children to learn to swim and potentially fostering Olympic athletes.
- Project estimated to cost \$40-50 million, likely to be phased.
- Encouraged support through their website (QR code provided), email list, and community outreach.

Midway Rising Update:

Jason Potter, Director of Development with Chelsea Investment Corporation (affordable housing partner), provided updates:

- The Environmental Impact Report (EIR) is expected to be released for public review in the next two weeks.
- Next informational workshop will be held at Council District 8 on Monday night in the Otay Mesa West State Road area.

Action Item- Election Results:

• The election ended officially at 4:00 PM.

- Marco (Goodwill) and Bob (Pacifica Companies) did not run for re-election, leaving two vacant seats.
- Derek and Karen were re-elected for three-year terms.
- Cathy Kenton was elected to a new seat, serving a three-year term.
- A motion was made by Ryan to accept the election results for the two renewals and one new seat was seconded by Tod and unanimously approved.
