| 16 | Petitioner Bryn Kirvin is the Executive Director of the City of San Diego Ethics | | |

- 4. This Stipulation resolves all factual and legal issues raised by the Commission without needing an administrative hearing to determine the Respondents' liability.
- 5. Respondent understands and knowingly and voluntarily waives any procedural rights under the SDMC including, but not limited to: a determination of probable cause, the issuance and receipt of an administrative complaint, the right to appear personally in any administrative hearing held in this matter, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses testifying at the hearing, the right to subpoena witnesses to testify at the hearing, and the right to have the Commission or an impartial hearing officer hear this matter.
- 6. Respondent agrees that the terms of this Stipulation constitute compliance with SDMC section 26.0450 in that the Stipulation includes a recitation of facts, a reference to each violation, and an order.
- 7. Respondent agrees to hold the City of San Diego and the Ethics Commission harmless from any claims or damages resulting from the Commission's investigation, this stipulated agreement, or any matter reasonably related to it.
- 8. Respondent acknowledges that this Stipulation is not binding upon any other law enforcement or government agency and does not preclude the Commission from referring this matter to, cooperating with, or assisting any other law enforcement or government agency regarding this or any other related matter.
- 9. The parties agree that if the Commission refuses to accept this Stipulation, it shall become null and void. Respondent further agrees that if the Commission rejects the Stipulation and a full evidentiary hearing becomes necessary, no member of the Commission or its staff shall be disqualified because of their prior consideration of this Stipulation.

Summary of Law and Facts

10. The Committee was selected for audit by a designee of the City Clerk in a random drawing conducted at a public meeting of the Ethics Commission held on September 14, 2023. Rosalba Gomez (the Auditor) audited the Committee's activity covering the period from February 10, 2021, through November 8, 2023.

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| 11. The Committee was formed to support Respondent's candidacy for the City Counci |
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| District 2 seat, which required Respondent to comply with San Diego's election laws, including |
| ECCO. |

- 12. ECCO requires any committee paying for written campaign literature supporting a City candidate to retain an "original sample of each item of *campaign literature* disseminated by the *candidate* or *committee*" for four years. (SDMC § 27.2925(c)(1) and (d), emphasis in original). ECCO requires the Respondent to make these records available to Ethics Commission staff upon request. (SDMC § 27.2925(f).)
- 13. During the audit of the Committee, the Auditor requested original copies of the campaign literature disseminated by the Committee.
- 14. In response, the Respondent provided materials to document the literature disseminated by the Committee, including twelve mailers. Respondent produced an original sample of 10 mailers. However, for two mailers (together totaling a little less than 20,000 pieces), Respondent did not produce an original sample of what was disseminated.

Count

Count 1 - Violation of Municipal Code Section 27.2925 - Recordkeeping

15. Respondent violated Municipal Code section 27.2925 by failing to maintain an original copy of two campaign mailers disseminated by the Committee.

Factors in Aggravation

16. The failure to maintain an original copy prohibited the Auditor from determining if the required "Ad paid for by" disclosures were present on the mailers disseminated and, thus, whether the disclosures met local and state requirements.

Factors in Mitigation

- 17. Respondent produced original copies of 10 of the 12 mailers disseminated, all of which included the required "paid for by" disclosures.
- 18. Respondent produced correspondence documenting their efforts to work with the subvendor to obtain and maintain original copies of all mailers; despite their efforts, the subvendor did not provide the campaign with original copies of two mailers.
