BALBOA PARK PARKING

- The City Council approved charging for parking at Balboa Park 6-2 with Councilmember Campillo absent due to a personal family matter.
- Councilmember Campillo voted against the initial policy to bring forward charges.
- People living outside the city will pay \$16 a day to park in lots closest to the park's center and \$10 a day to park in lots a bit farther out.
- City residents will pay \$8 a day to park in the most convenient lots, but will also get the
 option of paying only \$5 if they park there for less than four hours
 - City residents will pay \$5 a day to park in lots a farther out.

TRASH FEE

- The deadline for signing up for trash services following the approval of the trash fee, which Councilmember Campillo voted against and called a bait & switch, is September 30, 2025.

Info Item 2: Non-Agenda Public Comment. Any member of the public may address a community issue not elsewhere on this agenda. Ed Langmaid from Prepare Tierrasanta:

- Coming up earthquake drill => Great California Shakeout on October 16th at 10:16
 - Don't try to go to a different part of the building like a door frame (shaking will prevent you from getting there)
 - Don't try to leave the building because something could drop on you while you are trying to leave
 - o DO: Drop, cover, and hold on
- Prepare Tierrasanta will be providing handouts to local businesses to help them prepare for the earthquake drill
- Submitted an application to have a Tierrasanta fire safe council
 - It was approved last week
 - We have permission to acquire information and present it to the residents of Tierrasanta
 - We can also share info with other fire safe councils
 - We are in the high risk are for wildfires
- Question from Vince Cardoza: Are there any updates for the evacuation plan?

- That will be addressed by the fire safe council
- Question from Michael Ferrell: Where can you get CPR training in Tierrasanta?
 - Teaching compression only CPR at concerts in the park, and we could do that more often
 - Also getting a space near the 8 for more regular classes (full CPR certification)

Leslie Paculba: lives on Tambor Rd "at the bulb" for the last 30 years

- There used to be regular brush-clearing and they would update with a red flag to show they came
- For several years there was no activity (lots of brush and the drainage ditch was clogged)
- Positive: Jennifer Cochrane-Schultz is helping to get the brush cleared and the workers have been coming out for a year. She is really pleased.
 - o MAD:
 - West Coast Arborist => trees
 - Treebeard: Brow-ditch clear out
 - Brush Management from the city helped clear 100 foot zone

Info Item 3: Carol Kelley has moved out of state and can no longer represent The Village at Mission Valley.

- Carol moved to Cincinnati with her son and therefore needed to resign from being a TCC representative.

Info Item 4: Raise Lake Hodges; A Call to Protect North County and Rancho Santa Fe—Raise Lake Hodges to 293 Feet for Fire Prevention, Water Security, and Ecological Protection; Paul Bernstein; paulbernsteinmd@gmail.com; www.raiselakehodges.org Attachment: (2)

- Paul Bernstein along with Kevin Kidd, John Anshus, and Brian Caldwell
- They propose to raise the water level by 13 feet => submerge 100s of acres of brush to make it a firebreak
- This would not cost anything
 - o Rancho Bernardo Community Council has given their support
 - Rancho Santa Fe supports
 - o Sierra Club supports

- Currently at 280 foot level is set by the DSOD and it used to be 295 feet, lowering was due to fear of flooding after failure
 - o Cracks and rebar showing so the water level was lowered
 - But no structural analysis was performed
 - Chance of failure is extremely low according to a failure risk report
- Pump station is not being used because the water level is too low
- Question from James Hettinger: Clarification you are asking the city to raise the water level by 13 feet? Would that allow for reactivation of the pump and what water agencies would benefit?
 - City will not comment due to ongoing litigation
 - o County supports but cannot compel the City to raise the water level
 - State assembly supports having the insurance to lobby for raising the water level
 - Yes, this would allow reactivation of the pump
- Question from Ingrid Cornax: Can you provide the full reports (consequence reports and failure risk)?
 - Yes, but they are redacted
- Questions from Jennifer Cochrane-Schultz:
 - Would LA get water from raising the water level? No
 - Would the new dam project by Sacramento support San Diego? Yes
- Question from Dawn Nielsen-Lostritto: it seems the water level was higher recently than it was historically? How high would the water go (to the 15?) if we raised the water level? And what would happen if the dam failed?
 - No, it would come to the pedestrian bridge. Failure of the dam with a higher water level would not destroy a lot more homes than a failure at the current level
- Discussion and decision to support or not support raising Lake Hodges will be added as an action item to the agenda for a future meeting. Jeremy Brown would also like to include the City for their point of view.

Action Item 4: Discussion on Barbados wall maintenance communication to the city. Jim Hettinger; <u>jim.hettin@gmail.com</u>.

- Roughly 1400 feet and there are a lot areas that require repair and replacement, and it is a big safety hazard (it could fall over, particularly near De Portola where student hang out)
- James Hettinger wrote a letter and encourages us all to read it and send it to the city council and the city attorney
- It was built between 1971-1975 and the original plans do not seem to be available
- There are multiple areas that are not up to building standards
- The MAD has been building a second wall in front of where there are bulges and leaving the old wall in place. The MAD has also been painting and patching, but the wall is not structurally sound.
- Dawn Nielsen-Lostritto and Jennifer Cochrane-Schultz will look through the Tierra Times at the library to find out what has been historically been discussed regarding the wall
- We need to recheck the MAD formation documents
- Motion by Ingrid Cornax: Provide a copy of the letter and the supporting documents as logistically feasible to the TCC so it can be discussed and voted upon at the next meeting. Second by Vince Cardoza. The motion passed unanimously.

 - Good that we did only 6 concerts because we had to dig a little into our \$10000 buffer. Dawn will give us more details next month.

 - Month ago sent out a request for requests
 - o From Kiwanis (Jan) sent one item
 - Jim Hettinger also sent a response but Bob did not receive
 - Bob will send out a new request
 - Jeremy Brown: Have we made any progress on the golf carts and the dog park?
 - *Answer: Someone needs to pick them up and take them towards action.*
 - Dog park: we don't have the land and do not meet the requirements. Allied Gardens made a temporary dog park, but they had a place.
 - Vince would like to take up the golf cart issue

- Mission Trails Regional Park Liaison: Rich Thesing, Dawn Nielsen-Lostritto, Ingrid Cornax:
 - As per email from Rich Thiesing:
 - The big news is that the Bridge For Max in Mission Trails has been halted by the City Attorney's office and an unnamed party. No one is stating why to any of us.
 - In a previous TCC meeting we discussed that the bridge project lost federal funding
 - The pipeline realigning going on in the park has created an awful problem with reptiles and other little critters not being able to get to the other side of the road. The pavement gets upwards to 130 degrees and painfully fries and kills them. The pictures are heartbreaking.

Deer, coyotes and the such can clear the pipe but the little fellers can't. The pipe rolled off its blocks so the path was blocked. Lifting the pipe back up should allow for small animals to pass under.. It caused an outrage.

- Some facts about the park.
- 2.2 million visitors show up a year which is more than Yosemite, Cuyamaca, and all the other parks in California. That was found out by a pre-Covid count. The numbers may be higher now. I asked for these stats this last meeting, and we were all shocked at the answers.
- Also, 7000'kids show up for field trips.
- Only one rattlesnake bite this year.
- San Diego River Coalition: **Rich Thesing**, Dawn Nielsen-Lostritto, Ingrid Cornax
 - o Email from Rich Thiesing:
 - As for the San Diego River Coalition, 800 hours of volunteer hours were put in just in the month of July. On July 5th alone, one day, 700 pounds of trash was removed which otherwise would have washed into the river killing wildlife, plants and the like. Just imagine how much trash was removed in the entire month, month after month.
- Rock Quarry Conditional Use Permit: Rich Thesing.

 - Open Space Division and MAD report from Mario
 - Treebeard contract and making sure that they are following priorities of the community

 - o Brazilian peppers: West Coast Arborists will tackle that and herbicide work
