ITEM 1: *CELINE DEVELOPMENT (1620 STATE STREET) - PROJECT NO. 1130168

Staff: James Alexander **City Council District:** 3 **Plan Area**: Downtown

A Site Development Permit for the substantial alteration of a designated historical resource and construction of an eight-story, 91-foot-tall mixed-use development known as "Celine," comprised of 52 dwelling units, including seven affordable dwelling units, and 6,232 square feet of commercial space. The site is located on the 4,979-square-foot property at 1620 State Street on the west side of State Street between West Date Street and West Cedar Street in the Little Italy neighborhood of the Downtown Community Plan area, Residential Emphasis land use district of the Centre City Planned District, Airport Land Use Compatibility Land Use Overlay, Transit Priority Area Overlay, and Council District 3.

The project is consistent with the previously certified Downtown Final Environmental Impact Report, as amended, and no additional environmental document is required under the California Environmental Quality Act.

ITEM 2: *COLLEGE AREA COMMUNITY PLAN UPDATE

Staff: Nathen Causman **City Council District:** 9

Plan Area: College Area Community Planning Area

The College Area Community Plan Update is proposed to replace the 1989 College Area Community Plan for the approximately 2,000-acre College Area Community Plan Area located between Interstate 8 on the north, Fairmount Avenue on the west, 70th Street and the City of La Mesa on the east, and El Cajon Boulevard on the south.

The Community Plan Update provides a comprehensive policy framework for future growth and development over the next 20 to 30 years. Consistent with the General Plan and the Climate Action Plan, the Community Plan Update proposes a land use strategy with additional capacity for new homes within Climate Smart Village Areas where propensity to transit is greatest. The Community Plan Update also includes policies to provide a multi-modal transportation system to promote active transportation, increase transit use, and provide more connections in the community. The Community Plan Update proposes a new Community Plan Enhancement Overlay Zone that provides Supplemental Development Regulations to implement public space and connectivity requirements in locations that will increase in density. The Community Plan Update also proposes accompanying rezoning, amendments to the General Plan, Mid-City

Communities Plan, San Diego Municipal Code, and rescinds the Core Sub-Area Design Manual.

An addendum to Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) for Blueprint SD (SCR No. 2021070359) and associated amended Mitigation, Monitoring and Reporting Program is also proposed for the Collage Area Community Plan Update.
