The Department of Transportation published a new Interim Final rule limiting the eligibility of some categories of non-citizens for commercial driver's licenses (CDLs). Under the new rule, immigrants who are legally present and authorized to work in the U.S. are barred from holding CDLs, which are licenses required to operate commercial motor vehicles such as trucks and school buses.
