STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend to the City of San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture (Commission) that the City of San Diego (City) Cultural Affairs accept the proposed donation of an artwork for inclusion into the Civic Art Collection and for installation on the railing of the Olive Street Park AIDS Memorial at 2772 Third Avenue in Bankers Hill upon the fulfillment of six conditions:

- 1. All other City Departments that are stakeholders (i.e., Parks and Recreation) indicate support/approvals for the installation and exhibition of the artwork on the railing of the Olive Street Park AIDS Memorial at 2772 Third Avenue in Bankers Hill.
- 2. The donor San Diego AIDS Memorial Task Force agrees to donate the artwork as a gift to the City.
- 3. The San Diego AIDS Memorial Task Force and Michael Leaf agree to modify fabrication, transportation and installation plans, if requested by the City, to address any safety, liability, environmental and accessibility issues.
- 4. Donor and artist supply the City with a maintenance instruction manual in a format to be determined by Cultural Affairs staff.
- 5. The artist/copyright holder agrees to grant the City a nonexclusive irrevocable and royalty-free license to reproduce the artwork for all standard City educational, public relations, tourism and arts promotional

purposes.

6. The artist agrees to the City's standard Visual Artists Rights Act (VARA) and California Art Preservation Act (CAPA) waivers.

SUMMARY:

Cultural Affairs staff received a donation application from the San Diego AIDS Memorial Task Force (Donor). The Donor is proposing a gift to the City of San Diego (City) that includes a site-specific artwork to be installed on the railings of the Olive Street Park AIDS Memorial located at 2772 Third Avenue in Bankers Hill. Cultural Affairs staff evaluated the application utilizing the artwork accession criteria and site selection criteria contained in the City of San Diego Department Instruction - Collection Management Policy for the Civic Art Collection. The results of the Cultural Affairs staff's analysis include:

RE: ARTWORK CRITERIA

<u>Public Safety:</u> If the artwork is installed properly on the railings (i.e., methods and materials safe for the public), it is unlikely to pose hazards or threats to public safety or public health and/or is unlikely to pose a potential liability for the City in any other way. The artwork components will be fabricated off-site and mechanically fastened to railing in manner allowing for de-installation if necessary.

<u>Cost:</u> If the donation is accepted, the Donor will be responsible for the costs of initial transportation and installation of the artwork.

<u>Availability of Resources:</u> Cultural Affairs staff is available to provide administrative services to the Donor in order to execute a deed of gift and/or agreement.

Relevance: To the Collecting Mission: The artwork demonstrates an acceptable level of creativity of the artist, thus providing an aesthetic and cultural experience for San Diego's residents and visitors. The sculpture would serve as a site-specific commemorative artworkin the presently existing Olive Street Park San Diego AIDS Memorial. The artist lives and works in San Diego County (see bio for more information). Due to the placement of the artwork on a significant feature of the park, the artwork may serve to balance urbanization and development with humanizing elements. To the Scope of the Collection: The artwork falls within the scope of the collection in object type as well as chronological and geographical origin. The artist is not currently represented in the Civic Art Collection.

<u>Excellence:</u> The artwork exemplifies a satisfactory level of aesthetic quality and workmanship.

<u>Significance:</u> If accepted by the City, given the importance of the site, the artwork would be a significant public commission for the artist. The artist has

gone to great lengths to collaborate with Donor and the resulting artwork should be understood in this context. The artist has completed both public and private artwork commissions throughout San Diego County.

<u>Condition:</u> The Donor reported that the artwork will be newly constructed and is therefore in excellent condition.

<u>Maintenance:</u> Upon acceptance, the City will be responsible for ordinary and extraordinary maintenance and conservation. The artwork is made of resilient materials, and the construction, scale, and location of the artwork allows for relatively simple conservation and maintenance.

<u>Security:</u> The City is patrolled by the San Diego Police Department. Olive Street Park is administered and closely monitored by the City's Parks and Recreation Department.

Relationship to Site: The artwork is proposed to be sited on the railings of the Olive Street Park San Diego AIDS Memorial overlook located at 2772 Third Avenue in Bankers Hill. The artwork will serve to complete the Donor's vision for the AIDS Memorial, which presently includes memorial boulders and interpretive panels placed throughout the park, containing the history of the AIDS crisis in San Diego and honoring the many people and organizations who have served those living with AIDS. Additionally, the artwork will also serve to beautify the overlook and the surrounding community.

<u>Legal and Ethical Considerations:</u> If the donation of artwork is approved, it will be formalized in a deed of gift and/or agreement between the Donor and the City. The Donor has indicated that the artist will provide a royalty-free license to reproduce images of the artwork for noncommercial purposes. The artist will be required to agree to the terms of the City's standard Visual Artists Rights Act (VARA) and California Art Preservation Act (CAPA) waivers.

<u>Timing:</u> If the Donation is accepted, the Donor and the artist have indicated that fabrication will begin as soon as a formalized in a deed of gift and/or agreement between the Donor and the City is executed. Fabrication may take several weeks, and installation may take up to a week.

<u>Selection Process for the Artist:</u> The Donor established an arts committee to evaluate and recommend an artist for the project. After a review process, the arts committee presented a final recommendation to the Task Force for for submission to the City. The selected artist was chosen based on the strength of their design concept, the quality and scope of their professional portfolio, and their demonstrated history of artworks commissioned or selected by the County of San Diego.

<u>Community Feedback:</u> The artwork will comprise the final component of a community advocacy effort spanning decades (efforts beginning no later than 1994) that lead to both the establishment of Olive Street Park and the San

Diego AIDS Memorial.

<u>Restrictions:</u> While not a restriction of the donation, the artwork design is specific to the design and purpose of the Olive Street Park San Diego AIDS Memorial. If it is deemed necessary for the artwork to be installed elsewhere, the Donor has designed it so that it may be easily de-installed and reinstalled elsewhere.

<u>Commemorative Significance:</u> The Donor has indicated that the Olive Street Park San Diego AIDS Memorial and the proposed donation of artwork will together "serve as a permanent testament to the resilience, courage, and compassion of those affected by AIDS in our community—the nearly 8,000 San Diegans who have died from AIDS—and to the tireless work of those who have dedicated their lives to ending this epidemic."

Fair Exchange: Not applicable.

<u>Fair Purchase Price:</u> Not applicable.

RE: SITE SELECTION CRITERIA

<u>Ownership:</u> The City owns the Olive Street Park San Diego AIDS Memorial, which is recommended for siting the artwork.

<u>Public Safety:</u> If the artwork is installed properly on the railings (i.e. methods and materials safe for the public), it is unlikely to pose hazards or threats to public safety or public health and/or is unlikely to pose a potential liability for the City in any other way. The artwork components will be fabricated off-site and mechanically fastened to railing in manner allowing for de-installation if necessary.

<u>Security:</u> Olive Street Park is administered and closely monitored by the City's Parks and Recreation Department. The City is patrolled by the San Diego Police Department. However, theft and vandalism in the form of tagging still occurs from time to time.

<u>Maintenance:</u> Olive Street Park is managed by the Parks and Recreation Department of the City of San Diego.

<u>Accessibility:</u> The City complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and Council Policy 100–04 Americans with Disabilities Act/City Contractors. Prior to installation, City staff will review the placement of the artwork for ADA compliance.

<u>Context:</u> The artwork is proposed to be sited on the railing of the Olive Street Park AIDS Memorial overlook at 2772 Third Avenue in Bankers Hill. The artwork will serve to beautify the overlook and the surrounding community.

Support of City Departments: Cultural Affairs staff will route the donation

application with the analysis and recommendation from the Commission for Arts and Culture to relevant City departments for feedback and recommendations about the proposal.

<u>Community Support:</u> The artwork will comprise the final component of a community advocacy effort spanning decades (efforts beginning no later than 1994) that lead to both the establishment of Olive Street Park and the San Diego AIDS Memorial.

Adherence to Relevant Plans: The City adheres to existing community plans and land use plans, such as the City's General Plan.

Evaluation criteria the Public Art Committee (PAC) will use to decide whether to recommend to the Commission that City of San Diego Cultural Affairs accept the proposed donation may include all or some of those given in the City of San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture Department Instruction – Collection Management Policy for the Civic Art Collection.

City of San Diego Cultural Affairs will consider the recommendation from other relevant City staff, the Public Art Committee, the Commission, and any other pertinent stakeholders before making the final decision on whether to accept the proposed donation.

FISCAL CONSIDERATIONS:

If the City accepts the proposed donation, the artwork will be accessioned into the Civic Art Collection after its installed and inspected at the site. The Donor is responsible for all costs, including design, fabrication, transportation and installation. Ongoing maintenance and conservation will be the responsibility of the City.



This memorial honors all who have been lost to AIDS, those living with HIV, and all who have faced stigma and marginalization in the San Diego–Tijuana region and beyond.


It is a healing sanctuary for families, friends, and communities and a call to action to confront injustice, end stigma, and carry forward the voices of those we have lost.



San Diego AIDS Memorial – Digital Tribute and Story Archive

The San Diego AIDS Memorial will include a digital tribute platform designed to honor the memory of more than 10,000 San Diego residents who have lost their lives to AIDS. Accessible through a QR code displayed on memorial signage, visitors will be able to scan the code to view an evolving online archive of names, stories, and photos dedicated to those who have passed.

Each entry will serve as a personal remembrance, allowing families, friends, and community members to contribute stories, tributes, and images that celebrate the lives, courage, and legacy of loved ones. The website will also provide historical context about San Diego's response to the AIDS crisis and highlight the ongoing work of organizations supporting those affected by HIV today.

The digital memorial will function as a **living archive**, updated regularly to include new submissions and preserve existing content for future generations. It will be **maintained and curated by the San Diego AIDS Task Force** in partnership with **Being Alive San Diego**, the project's fiscal sponsor and recognized 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization (EIN: 33-0439092).

This digital component ensures that the San Diego AIDS Memorial is not only a place of remembrance but also a platform for storytelling, education, and collective healing—keeping the memory of every life lost alive in our shared history.

project for the new 550 acre redevelopment project in South Bay on the Bay front set to be completed 2024-2025.

Manifested was the first ever art show held at Michael Leaf Design headquarters, debuting 75 never before seen artworks.

<u>2017</u>: Worked with a commercial developer who commissioned an 8ft tall metal, LED internally lit pine cone that will be suspended roughly 16ft above ground from a gateway bridge in Medford Oregon 2018.

<u>2018:</u> Created 10 private artworks for private collectors nationally and internationally. Michael is continuing the development for public art projects in both San Francisco and Lake Tahoe.

2019: Created 15 private artworks for collectors nationally and internationally. One artwork is a 250ft linear sculpture wrapping around the collectors home in Solana Beach. Continuing development for public art projects in La Jolla, San Francisco, Lake Tahoe.

<u>2020:</u> Created artworks for private collectors. Redesigned and built new Michael Leaf Design headquarters. (Michael personally designed and built these buildings by hand)

2021: Shifted all focus to developing the second to scale Last Supper on Planet Earth.

2022: Continuing to build the second to scale Last Supper on Planet Earth. Michael has decided until this project is complete, he will not be accepting any other commissions or projects.

2023: Completed second to scale Last Supper rendition on planet earth and has already gained global attention. Launched a (50) piece series on the Last Supper, (50) of (50) have been acquired by national collectors in first mont of launch.


