



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The Office of Child & Youth Success (OCYS) serves as a navigation and connection point for residents seeking supportive services and programming for youth ages 24 and below.



We hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving Holiday and spent time with your family, friends and had a little bit of down time. So now that you have successfully submitted your UC and CSU application and in some cases your Common Applications, what's next? In this issue we will focus on what you need to know for next steps planning after you have successfully submitted your college applications.

YOU SUBMITTED YOUR UC & CSU APPLICATIONSWHAT'S NEXT?

Congrats on submitting your UC and CSU applications! While the hard part is done, the next few months are just as important. Here's what to focus on now:

Check your email and set up applicant portals

 Each campus will send instructions to activate your portal. Use it to track your application, upload documents, view financial aid items, and eventually see decisions.

Tip: Check email (and spam) often and activate portals right away.

Monitor & Update your application

- UC: Report schedule changes, D/F grades, or major academic updates through your portal.
- CSU: Some campuses require supplemental updates or additional documents.

Tip: Respond quickly—missing information can delay or impact admission.

Complete FAFSA or California Dream Act App.

- Submit early and list all UC/CSU campuses.
- The priority deadline is March 2.

Tip: Check campus financial aid portals for extra forms like Cal Grant GPA verification.

Keep Your Grades Strong

 Admission is conditional. Avoid senioritis-large drops in grades can affect your offer.

Tip: Ask for help early if school gets overwhelming.

Track New Achievements

 Keep a record of new awards, activities, jobs, or responsibilities - helpful for scholarships or campus requests.

Apply for Scholarships

• Deadlines come early, look for local, campus based, and national scholarships.

Tip: Small awards add up!

Research Housing Opportunities

• Some campuses open housing applications close before decisions. Explore residence halls, meal plans, and costs now.

Tip: Note priority housing dates.

Visit or Explore Campuses

 Use winter and spring for tours and admittedstudent events. This helps when making your final choice.

Get Ready for Decision Season

• Expect decisions: UC: Mid-March CSU: January-April Start thinking about what matters most (programs, costs, distance, supportive services, etc.)

Stay Organized-And Celebrate!

• Use a planner or digital calendar to track requests and deadlines. Take pride in how far you've already come.




Balboa Park: San Diego's Cultural Playground

Rich in culture, creativity, and community. Whether you're exploring a museum, walking through historic architecture, or catching a festival, there's always something happening here.



Japanese Friendship Garden


Not exactly "hidden," but still underrated.

If you're a grandparent or other relative raising a child in your family, you're not alone. The Y is here to help!

WHO WE SERVE:

We serve Kinship caregivers that are raising a family member's child (also those that are not related, but like family). We serve Kinship caregivers that have a child placed by Child and Family Well-Being (CFWB) and those that have no CFWB involvement.

WHAT FAMILIES CAN EXPECT TO RECEIVE:

- Convenient services including home visits and flexible meeting times.
- · An assessment of your needs & resources to support you in raising your Kin child.
- Information about parenting children that have experienced trauma.
- Supportive services that walk you through complicated systems and application processes.

SERVICES INCLUDE:

Kinship Navigation— Assistance navigating systems and accessing resources to support you in raising a relative's child. Kinship Navigators can help access resources for needs such as:

- Guardianship & Adoption
- Public Benefits
- Childcare & Basic Needs Items
- Education & Mental Health Services
- · Enrichment activities

Support Groups—weekly groups providing peer support, training by Grossmont College, childcare, and a light meal.

Family Events—quarterly regional events for networking and fun.

Respite Care—a break or rest for caregivers age 55 and over.

2026 Summer Internships

The Child Mind Institute's Youth Mental Health Academy (YMHA) is a paid, community-based career development program for high school and early college students. It gives students from traditionally underserved communities, including BIPOC and LGBTQIA+ teens, an opportunity to gain valuable knowledge and experience in the mental health field.

By providing mentorship and training to high school students in underserved communities, we aim to inspire and cultivate tomorrow's mental health leaders — but we can't do it alone. We are seeking organizations to provide internships for groups of 5+ students in person in California or remotely anywhere in the United States during summer 2026.

Internship Details

- Internships will be 80 to 100 hours (e.g., 16–20 hours/week for five weeks).
- Must occur between mid-June to mid-August 2026.
- Can be with organizations focused on clinical work, research, community outreach, media, technology, or public policy in mental health and related fields.
- Work setting can be in-person, remote, or hybrid.

YMHA interns can support organizations with: Community outreach, peer-to-peer support, social media, desktop research, workshop facilitation, youth feedback and advisory, youth supervision, planning, and hosting events, data analysis, administrative tasks — and more!

About the Interns

- Primarily 16–19 years old
- Located across California: Bay Area, Inland Empire, Kern, Los Angeles, Sacramento, San Diego
- Completed the 2025 Youth Mental Health Academy summer program
- Received Adolescent Crisis Response training

Internship Support

- YMHA pays interns a stipend of up to \$2,000 for their work.
- Interns will have access to YMHA mentors and professional development workshops.
- The YMHA team will assist in the onboarding process for your site and provide open office hours for both interns and hosts to address questions or issues.

Process & Timeline

The Youth Mental Health Academy will work with internship partners to understand their organizational needs and onboarding requirements to facilitate the matching process with our students during spring 2026.
