It is an honor and a privilege to serve alongside all of you, bringing high-quality parks and programs to all San Diegans. I am proud of the work you do each day and appreciate your commitment to the “heart of service” daily.

This past year has been one of the most challenging in my career, but as they say, challenges bring opportunities. The City’s budget development process was difficult, but we were able to avoid layoffs within our department. We have had some significant successes in 2025. We hosted two major golf events at Torrey Pines Golf Course, the Farmers Insurance Open and the Genesis Invitational. Parks After Dark expanded to encompass five locations (City Heights, Linda Vista, Memorial, Silver Wing, and Skyline Hills). We were able to reopen the Carmel Mountain Ranch Pool and the Memorial Senior Center in Logan Heights. 2025 was the first full year of operation for our new Botanical Building in Balboa Park, proudly managed by City staff. Two

very large projects – East Village Green and Mira Mesa Community Park and Aquatic Center – are scheduled to open in 2026. We have had increased attendance and participation at many of our seasonal events and our growing City Sports Leagues. Every division and every Department employee had a role in helping make these big things happen for our park system. Together, we have made our park spaces welcoming for all San Diegans!

Thank you for all that you do. I hope that you find peace and happiness during this holiday season with your families and friends. With much excitement, I look forward to working alongside you in 2026 to continue to provide quality parks and programs to San Diegans. I wish you Happy Holidays and the most enjoyable New Year!

City of San Diego Celebrates Upgrades at Coral Gate



The City of San Diego recently completed major improvements at Coral Gate Neighborhood Park in San Ysidro, marking its first substantial upgrades since the park opened in the early 2000s.

The \$4.94 million renovation included new play equipment and safety surfacing, upgraded security lighting, ADA access, and site furnishings. Other enhancements include a drinking fountain, turf area, picnic tables, stormwater improvements, and additional trees and vegetation.



Responding to community input, the playground features a seaside design and a range of age-appropriate equipment for children of all abilities. Highlights include a 2–5 structure and a 5–12 structure with a unique geometric layout and continuous circuits that encourage exploration and provide repeated play experiences. Freestanding components like the We-Go-Round® and We-saw™ offer opportunities for collaborative play, while the ZipKrooz® zip line provides a safe, exciting adventure. The swing set includes inclusive molded bucket seats with harnesses and chains, providing stability for children with limited upper-body strength.

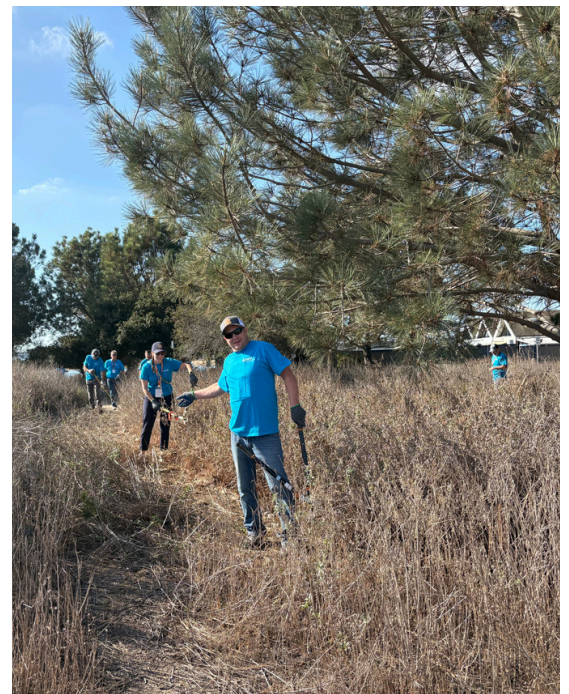
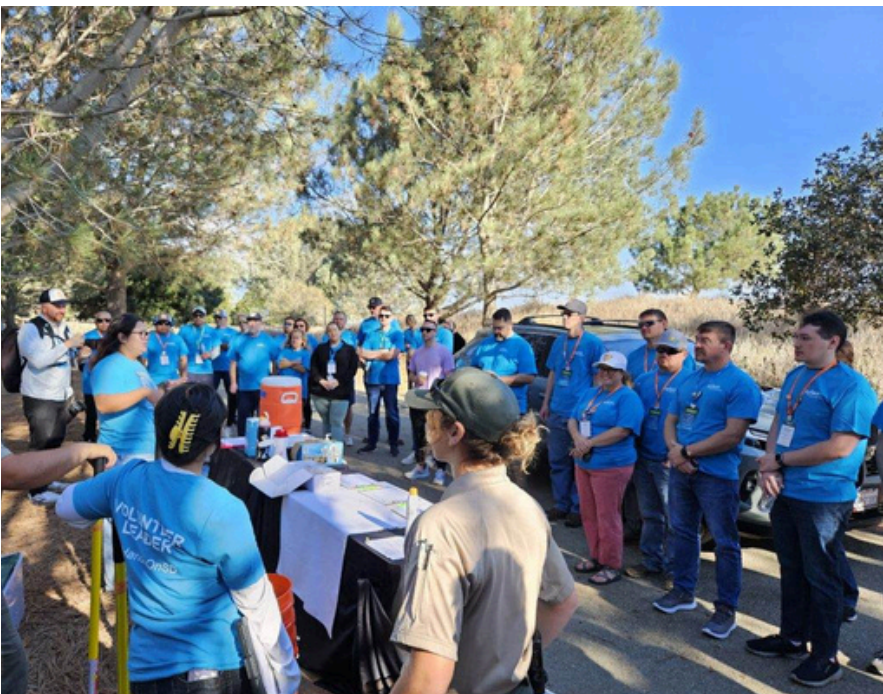

Watershed Enhancement Team (WET) Accomplishments



The Watershed Enhancement Team (WET), a small, dedicated crew of volunteers and Rangers from the San Diego River Park, celebrated their fourth successful year in the San Diego River Watershed. Together the team removed an estimated 38,990 lbs of trash, trimmed 4,805 linear feet of trail, and removed 170 cubic yds of invasive species in 2025! Volunteers participated in 45 weekly events, donating over 603 hours of service to improving the health of the San Diego River and canyon tributaries! Many thanks to our incredibly hardworking volunteers, the new San Diego River Park Rangers for diving right in to support this effort, Rangers from Open Space Canyons for helping haul countless truckloads of trash, MTRP for kindly sharing their dumpster, and ESD for helping us with disposal! Stellar work, everyone!!!

Great job to everyone involved—we look forward to an even bigger showcase next year!



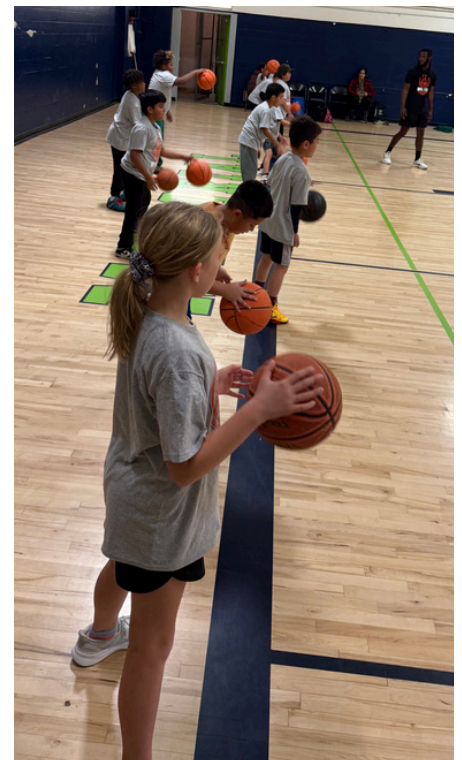
2025 Youth Basketball Clinic

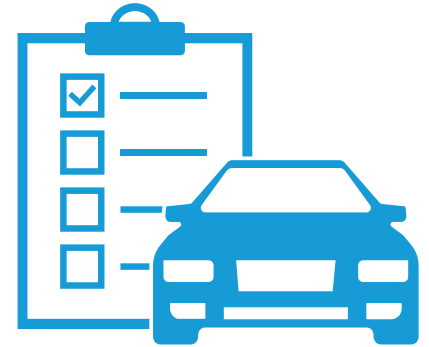


SAFETY AND TRAINING

- **Stay Distraction-Free:** No texting, eating, or multitasking while driving.
- **Report Immediately:** If a vehicle incident happens, report it right away to your supervisor AND Station 38.
