




COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT

Maria Bojorquez-Gomez



Maria Bojorquez-Gomez grew up in Tijuana, Mexico, and later moved to San Diego County when she was 8 years old. Her involvement in the Promise Zone stemmed from her time at [Pacific Community Fund](#) (PCF). At the recommendation of Congressman Juan Vargas' office, PCF collaborated with the Promise Zone to ensure they were reaching low- to moderate-income communities that could benefit from their credit-building programs. Maria's experience as the Director of Operations brought together her experience working in government, the nonprofit sector and communications. Having focused her career on working with mission-based organizations, the Promise Zone provided a crucial avenue to share direct financial resources with the local community. This year, she has been involved in the Economic Activity and Housing Affordability Working Groups.

Maria is particularly proud of two things: representing PCF at the San Diego North County 10th Annual Business Expo and serving as the point of contact for the [Small Dollar Loan Partners](#) program for the SDPZ community. For her, the Promise Zone represents a commitment by the community to uplift each other and improve the quality of life.

Maria attended Haverford College as an undergraduate. When she is not busy, she's usually playing with her tuxedo cat, reading books and comics, and spending time with friends or outdoors. Maria feels most at peace on her yoga mat.



Think you might qualify?

All college students must meet the [SNAP eligibility criteria](#) to receive food assistance.

If you're enrolled half-time or more, you must also meet **at least ONE** of the following [conditions](#):

- Work 20+ hours per week
- Participate in a federal or state work-study program
- Have a physical or mental disability or condition that prevents you from working
- Care for a young dependent child
- Receive Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Enrolled in college through certain employment & training programs, such as SNAP E&T, Workforce and Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA), and others
- Participate in an on-the-job training program
- Be under age 18 or over 49

The Housing Our Youth (HOY) program offers specialized support for youth and young adults ages 16–24 in San Diego County who are at-risk of, or currently experiencing, homelessness. Participants enrolled in the program receive services including assistance and connection, resource navigation, employment and education support, and other wraparound services tailored to help them achieve stable housing and work toward self-sufficiency. 

Plan Ahead: Paid Parking Coming to Balboa Park in 2026

As we start the new year, the City of San Diego is encouraging visitors to plan ahead for upcoming changes to parking at Balboa Park. In November, the San Diego City Council approved a new paid parking program for all Balboa Park parking lots and in-park roads, which is scheduled to begin on January 5, 2026.

The new system will offer monthly, quarterly and annual parking passes, with discounted rates for verified City of San Diego residents. Non-residents will pay higher rates. For those without passes, hourly and daily parking fees will apply depending on location, with in-park road meters set at \$2.50 per hour.

Free parking options will still be available in certain cases. Lower Inspiration Point will continue to offer the first three hours free for all visitors, and individuals with a valid ADA placard may park for free in designated spaces and park roads. Registered staff and volunteers working with park-based organizations will also continue to receive free parking while on duty.

Parking revenue collected within Balboa Park will be reinvested directly into park operations, maintenance and transportation improvements. The City will also continue offering free, ADA-accessible tram service from Inspiration Point, with plans to expand shuttle services as the program rolls out.



OVERVIEW



ABOUT THE PROMISE ZONE

In 2016, the San Diego Promise Zone became one of 22 federally designated Promise Zones in the United States and one of only four in California. The San Diego Promise Zone covers a 6.4-square-mile targeted area with more than 80,000 residents that spans East Village and Barrio Logan east to Encanto. It is home to the City's most culturally rich and ethnically diverse neighborhoods but also some of the most under-resourced communities.

Through the [Promise Zone initiative](#), community-based organizations (CBOs), direct service providers, residents and business owners work with government agencies to enhance collective impact, streamline resources and deliver comprehensive support.


Between 2016 and 2023, the unemployment rate decreased from 14% to 10%, and the poverty rate fell from 35% to 20% (ACS, 2016-22). We recognize there are many factors that contribute to these numbers. We do know that in the eight years since the designation, targeted efforts from the City and CBOs have supported improvement in these areas; however, we recognize there is still plenty of work to do to continue advocating for our Promise Zone residents.

- Increase access to healthy foods.
- Improve access to healthcare.
- Support opportunities for active transportation and active living.

- Dialogue with residents.
- Create environments conducive to learning and working.
- Improve infrastructure.

- Increase and improve access to capital.

WORKING GROUP GOALS



- Create and preserve affordable housing.
- Support renters, first-time homebuyers and people without housing.

- Cultivate opportunities for career exploration, applied learning and youth leadership.
- Create meaningful summer employment experiences for teenagers.

- Increase the number of students meeting school readiness and grade-level expectations.
- Increase educational and career supports for opportunity youth.
