## Projects Completed



- E.B. Scripps Park sod replacement project: The area was prepped by the Citywide Maintenance Division, and new sod was installed to enhance the use and beautification of our coastal areas. A ribbon-cutting event was held on Dec. 19 with 50 in attendance.
- Tree Lighting event at La Jolla Recreation Center: The SDPF worked with City staff and the La Jolla Rotary Club to bring this tradition to the community. The tree was lit up for all to enjoy through Jan. 5, 2026.

# SAGE CANYON NEIGHBORHOOD PARK

## *Construction Project Update*

Sage Canyon Neighborhood Park is under construction and has reached an important milestone with the recent placement of the new stand-alone comfort station. Seeing the building set in place marks a clear step forward toward providing updated ADA restroom facilities and a concession stand for park visitors.



While there is still considerable work to be completed—including interior finishes, utility connections, site improvements, and ADA path-of-travel enhancements—this milestone reflects steady progress on the project. The work is being delivered by the City’s Engineering and Capital Improvements in-house design team, which is responsible for designing and building the project to meet City standards and safety requirements.

# GRATEFUL

By the time Lucas arrived in San Diego in 2018, he'd lived through a mother struggling with substance abuse, the foster care system, and elderly grandparents who adopted him and then fell terminally ill. It was a lot for any child, let alone one with developmental disabilities. By the time he was 9, Lucas was an orphan and came to live with me and my husband in San Diego. Despite already raising two children entirely on our own, Lucas proved quite a challenge. His sunny disposition and genuine kindness and curiosity hid a traumatized child unsure about his role in this new family. He also was used to sneaking around and getting what he wanted through persistent annoyance. The long COVID lockdowns and lack of socialization during most of his middle-school years did not help. By high school, we were struggling with behaviors we couldn't understand nor control. Our pediatrician tried different medications and dosages. A psychologist dropped Lucas as a client. A psychiatrist just kept suggesting new prescriptions as a solution. We all shed a lot of tears in those years.

Then one night a parent we knew from another program recommended TRS. She asked if we'd be willing to drive to City Heights from our home in North County. We quickly arranged for an assessment and immediately signed Lucas up for his first Kick Back Club. He loved it, and from there we signed up for more. Lucas joined a dance club and performed in the annual talent show. He went on field trips and did fun runs. An extrovert, Lucas had found a social outlet and we, both introverts, had found some respite. Together, the formula lifted the black cloud that had hung over us. We saw an immediate change in Lucas, who no longer moped or fought us on every request to clean his room or take out the trash. He was happy ... and hopeful. His teacher noticed a difference, too, and asked us what had changed. We told him about the Parks & Rec program that had given Lucas a new lease on life. My husband and I met other parents of kids like Lucas, people who recommended other programs or outings for developmentally disabled teens. Who didn't disappear soon after an introduction, for fear we might ask for a playdate.

I can't overstate the difference TRS has made to our family. We are all so grateful to be part of such an impactful program.

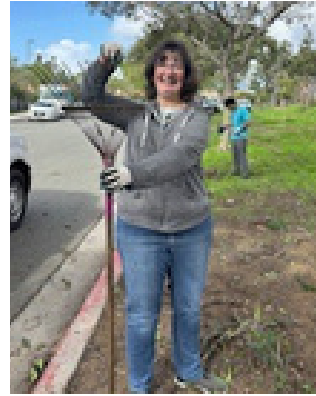

### *Community Parks I Division: Clean up in University City Area*

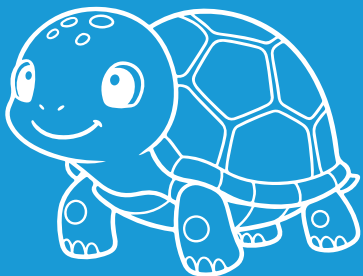


Our first project of the year was a cleanup in the University City area, and over 30 volunteers participated.

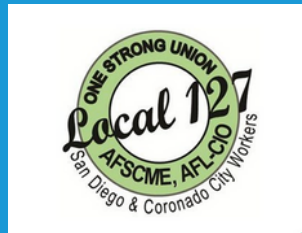

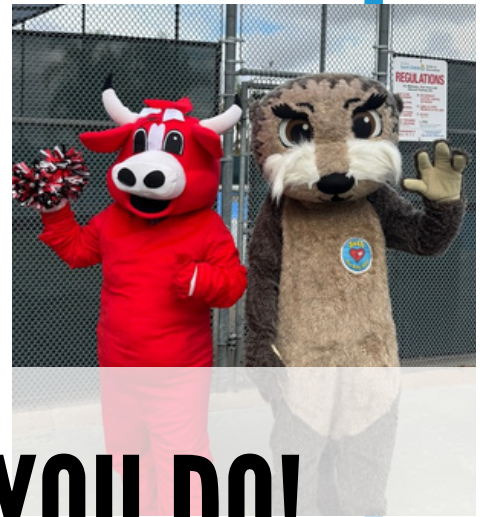
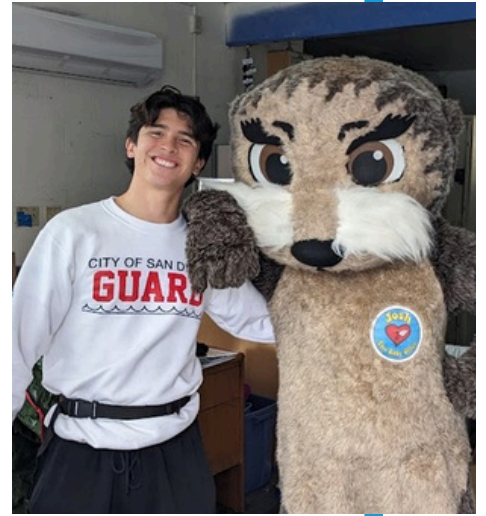
