

## Overview

---

The 2026 Resiliency Advisory Board Work Plan (Work Plan) establishes a program for the Resiliency Advisory Board to carry out its duties and functions during calendar year 2026. The Work Plan focuses the Board's efforts on its primary mandate to advise the Mayor and City Council on climate resilience and biodiversity matters associated with various City plans, policies, regulations and initiatives; and two Priority Goals identified by the Board as of particular importance and timeliness.

# Duties and Functions

---

The Resiliency Advisory Board (RAB) was established in 2023 to advise the Mayor and the Council and assist the City of San Diego (City) in attaining its goals in natural resource conservation, climate resiliency and adaptation, wetlands, habitat preservation, biodiversity, and the Climate Resilient SD Plan. Section 26.1003 of the San Diego Municipal Code specifies the duties and functions of the Board as follows:

- Advise the Mayor, City Council and relevant City departments on resiliency-related policies, including the City's Climate Resilient SD Plan, as amended from time to time, Multiple Species Conservation Program (MSCP), Biodiverse SD, Climate Action Plan Strategy 5 Resilient Infrastructure and Healthy Ecosystems, and other conservation and open space programs.
- Advise the Mayor, City Council and relevant City departments on issues related to climate mitigation and adaptation, natural space restoration, biodiversity, and conservation as they relate to the purposes of the Board, and on the best approaches for implementing the City's resiliency, biodiversity, and other related goals.
- Develop recommendations on how the City can engage residents, communities, and non-governmental organizations to guide the implementation of the Climate Resilient SD Plan and other relevant plans or strategies, including providing input on plans, measures, budget priorities, and other community engagement initiatives.
- Engage with regional businesses, political leaders, and public interest groups in the areas of resiliency, climate, conservation, biodiversity, environmental justice, and wetlands, and hold public forums for such input.
- Coordinate with other City advisory boards and City departments, such as the Community Forest Advisory Board, Planning Commission, the Climate Advisory Board, and Open Space Community Advisory Committee as needed and as it relates to the purposes of the Board.
- Provide periodic reports to the Environment Committee and make recommendations for the City to engage in regional resiliency and biodiversity issues at the state and federal levels, including securing state and federal funding for resiliency-related issues.

# 2026 Goals

---

## ***Primary Goal: Advise on climate resiliency and biodiversity related matters.***

Advise the Mayor, City Council and relevant City departments on climate resiliency and adaptation, wetlands, habitat preservation, and biodiversity matters associated with various City plans, policies, regulations and initiatives

## ***Priority Goal 1: Stormwater management and response***

**U**nprecedented flooding in January 2024 disproportionately impacted residents in southeastern San Diego, causing devastating damage and underscoring the need for communities to be prepared for more intense weather events exacerbated by climate change. The City of San Diego Stormwater Department consistently has insufficient funding to meet current and future needs and cannot accomplish the projects it has prioritized.<sup>1</sup> Poorly functioning stormwater infrastructure results in human health impacts, water quality degradation, and cumulative and complex ecological impacts. All these are environmental justice issues felt differently by communities throughout the City.

The RAB will invite presentations and discussions on this subject, including on regional predictions for climate-driven storm events; a review of City's response to 2024 floods and more recent storm events; Stormwater Department operations and financing, community and business readiness, impacts on human populations and ecosystems, and best practices and comparable municipalities' approaches.

The Board will hold up to two special meetings in Southeastern communities to hear and receive feedback from residents and business owners. This year's Annual Report will feature a set of pragmatic recommendations.

## ***Priority Goal 2: Improve Board process and accountability***

The Board's role advising City leadership on resiliency priorities necessitates its members truly understand the needs across Council Districts, residents, economic sectors, and ecosystems. The RAB will strongly engage with the communities most vulnerable to climate change impacts. Objectives include: (1) holding up to two special meetings in Council Districts 4, 8, and/or 9 (at convenient times and in hybrid format for maximum community participation) and (2) proactive outreach to community-based organizations, local businesses, and faith entities. Board Members (jointly or individually) will be responsible for identifying at least one presenter on a topic relevant to the Board and securing their presentation.


The Board will also collaborate with the Mayor and City Council to fill the three vacant Board seats.

## Resiliency Topics

---

The 2026 Annual Work Plan focuses primarily on the Primary and Priority Goals, but the Board may continue to invite presentations and discussion on other resiliency-related topics. Potential areas of interest include climate change implications for homelessness, public health, emergency management, and energy and the electrical grid.


