**Item 2: Approval of the Meeting Minutes (Action)**

Chair Reeves asked the Mobility Board to review and approve the minutes from its December 3, 2025 meeting.

There were no public comments on this item.

Action: Upon a motion by Michael Donovan and a second by Steve Gelb, the Mobility Board voted to approve the December 3, 2025 meeting minutes with all members in attendance voting “yes” to approve the meeting minutes.

**Item 3: Non-Agenda Public Comment**

There were no public comments on this item.

**Item 4: Speed Management Plan (Action)**

Everett Hauser presented the Citywide Speed Management Plan including details on safety improvements on the Systemic Safety Network, Business Activity Districts, and School Zones. Board

members asked about public noticing of implementation (when it occurs) and how enforcement would happen. Board members also asked if speed changes would happen concurrent with the capital infrastructure changes. Issues about integration with other priorities and project bundling opportunities were discussed as well as the inclusion of neighborhood streets. The issue of program or project evaluation was also shared with staff. Also, quick build vs. traditional build approaches were discussed and the merits of both. Finally, the longevity of quick build installations were shared along with how the Speed Management Plan network will be released.

There was one public comment on this item which was in support.

Action: Upon motion from Harry Bubbins and second by Haylee Ann Rea the Board moved to support the Plan and recommend approval to the City's Active Transportation and Infrastructure Committee. The motion was unanimously approved by all Board members in attendance.

**Item 5: Subcommittee Updates (Discussion/ Possible Action)**

**5.a. ATI Workplan Subcommittee Activities**

Anar Salayev shared the proposed letter requesting revisions to Council Policy 200-07 (Marked Crosswalk Criteria at Uncontrolled and Controlled Locations). Board members asked about application to bicycle crossings.

There were two public comments on this item which were in support.

Action: Upon a motion from Michael Donovan and second from Stephan Vance, the Board moved to send the letter with Council Policy 200-07 changes to the City's Council offices and Transportation Department. The motion was unanimously approved by all Board members in attendance.

**5.b. Budget Subcommittee Activities**

Daniel Reeves shared the budget priorities developed by the subcommittee. Some of the issues included in the proposed letter are projects addressing safety issues, implementing low or lower cost solutions, major mobility projects, developing planning and pilots, and district priorities. Board members discussed parking revenue prioritization, several changes to district priorities, traffic enforcement enhancements, inclusion of Rose Creek Bikeway, and other minor edits.

There were no public comments on this item.

Action: Upon a motion from Michael Donovan and second from Steve Gelb the Board moved to send the budget priority letter to the City with the inclusion of changes as discussed. The motion was unanimously approved by all Board members in attendance.
