Upcoming Form 700 Deadline and New Requirements

When is the Form 700 Due?

Your Statement of Economic Interests (SEI or Form 700) must be filed by **Wednesday, April 1, 2026**.

The Ethics Commission is available to advise you about the contents of your SEI, including what you may need to disclose. However, questions regarding SEI filing logistics should be directed to the City Clerk's eFile team at cityclerk@saniego.gov or by calling (619) 533-4000.

Please forward your questions to the Ethics Commission and/or the City Clerk's office as soon as possible. As a reminder, Tuesday, March 31 is a City holiday.

Failure to timely file your Form 700 can result in fines from the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC).

What are the new filing requirements this year?

Recently the FPPC voted to adopt a new form attachment (700-P Attachment) for California Government Code 87200¹ filers (Section 87200 Filers) to disclose an arrangement for

¹ California Government Code Section 87200 states: "This article is applicable to elected state officers, judges and commissioners of courts of the judicial branch of government, members of the Public Utilities Commission, members of the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission, members of the Fair Political Practices Commission, members of the California Coastal Commission, members of the High-Speed Rail Authority, members of planning commissions, members of the board of supervisors, district attorneys, county counsels, county treasurers, and chief administrative officers of counties, mayors, city managers, city attorneys, city treasurers, chief administrative officers and members of city councils of cities, and other

prospective employment, which is defined as “an agreement pursuant to which a prospective employer's offer of employment has been accepted by the prospective employee, including through verbal or written acceptance.”² Section 87200 Filers are generally high-level City employees³, including the Mayor, City Attorney, and members of the City Council.

All Section 87200 Filers – whether elected, candidates for elected office, or appointed – must file the 700-P Attachment if applicable.

On the 700-P Attachment, Section 87200 Filers are now required to report:

- (1) the name and street address of the prospective employer;
- (2) a general description of the business activity of the prospective employer;
- (3) the filer's business position; and
- (4) the date that the filer accepted the prospective employer's offer of employment.

³ High Level Filer is defined in San Diego Municipal Code Section 27.3503 as follows: “High Level Filer means the Mayor, the members of the City Council, the City Attorney, the City Manager (Chief Operating Officer), the City Treasurer, the City Comptroller, the Chief Financial Officer, the Chief Investment Officer, Investment Officers, members of the Planning Commission, members of the Funds Commission, members of the Retirement Board, members of the Defined Contribution Plan Board, any candidate for an elective office of the City, and any other individual whose position is specified in California Government Code section 87200.”
