Item 8: Information Items

a) Resiliency topic: Atmospheric Rivers, Flooding and Climate Change, Dr. Deanna Nash, Center for Western Weather and Water Extremes, Scripps Institution of Oceanography

Dr. Nash presented on atmospheric rivers, emphasizing:

- Atmospheric rivers as a major driver of California's water supply and flood risk
- Increasing precipitation variability and forecasting challenges
- Atmospheric rivers responsible for a significant portion of flooding impacts
- Improvements in forecasting through atmospheric data collection programs
- Climate projections indicating:
 - Fewer rainy days but higher intensity storms
 - Increased atmospheric rivers driven precipitation
 - Greater flood risk and infrastructure strain

Board members discussed ecological impacts, forecasting uncertainty, El Niño/La Niña relationships, infrastructure implications, and changing definitions of storm frequency.

Public comment was provided that there are many ties to trees, especially young trees.

b) Phase I Los Peñasquitos Lagoon Restoration Project, Brianna Menke, Deputy Director, Stormwater Department; Ronak Rekani, Senior Civil Engineer, Engineering & Capital Projects Department

Staff presented an overview of the Phase 1 Los Peñasquitos Lagoon Restoration Project, including:

- Project goals to restore lagoon function and improve flood resilience
- Sediment management strategies, including sediment basins and watershed coordination
- Ongoing water quality improvement efforts through regional watershed programs
- Monitoring requirements, including sediment tracking and water quality sampling
- Coordination with multiple jurisdictions and regulatory requirements

Board members asked questions regarding definition and implications of 10-year and 100-year storm events, need for updated planning metrics under changing climate conditions and desire for consolidated reporting on sediment reduction trends and project effectiveness.

The Board discussed planning for a special community meeting to be held off-site in April 2026. The purpose is to:

- Introduce the Resiliency Advisory Board to the public
- Conduct a listening session to gather community input on resilience priorities
