# **Man Arrested for Homicide Three Weeks After Barrio Logan Assault**

**San Diego** — A man was violently assaulted at an MTS station in Barrio Logan on March 18, 2026. He was transported to a hospital that day and died about one week later. A suspect in the case was later identified and arrested today.

On March 18, 2026, at approximately 2:24 p.m., Javier Teran-Pascasio was punched once in the face and collapsed to the ground at the MTS station located at 1255 Imperial Avenue. Teran-Pascasio is described as a 38-year-old man. The event was initially believed to be a medical emergency and San Diego Fire-Rescue personnel were called to the scene to treat him. He was transported to a local hospital. It was later determined Teran-Pascasio's injuries were the result of the assault and police were called to investigate the battery. The suspect in the case was described as a Black male adult, and he was believed to have fled the scene on an E-bike.

The following day, MTS dispatch called SDPD and reported seeing a person matching the description of the assault suspect at the same location. Officers contacted the man, later identified as 27-year-old Kenny Dunn (aka: Kenny Corzine). At that time, no witnesses were able to positively identify Dunn as the suspect, and Dunn was released.

Teran-Pascasio never regained consciousness and on March 25, 2026, he died as a result of his injuries. The SDPD Homicide Unit assumed responsibility for the case and through their investigation, determined Dunn was in fact the person who assaulted Teran-Pascasio. The relationship between Dunn and Teran-Pascasio is unknown at this time.

On April 7, 2026, detectives located and arrested Dunn for the case in the area of 1300 East 30<sup>th</sup> Street in National City.
