Two Additional Suspects Arrested in Fatal Barrio Logan Stabbing

San Diego – A man and woman were both arrested for their roles in a fatal Barrio Logan stabbing that occurred approximately three weeks ago.

On March 27, 2026, at about 11:13 p.m. San Diego Police Communications received multiple reports of a man stabbed in the south alley of 1600 Logan Avenue. As officers arrived, they observed the victim, described as a 28-year-old male of Somalian decent, collapse to the ground. He was identified as Abdifatah Hussein. Medical aid was provided at the scene. Hussein was transported to a local hospital, but unfortunately, he did not survive his injuries.

The Homicide Unit responded and is conducting the investigation. The preliminary information received by investigators indicated the victim was surrounded by a group of three Hispanic males and a Hispanic female and was attacked by some in the group. Officers detained a male and a female shortly after the stabbing, but they have since been released pending additional investigation. As detectives continued speaking to witnesses and reviewing security footage, they determined a black adult male was also part of the suspect group. Investigators identified this person as 45-year-old Geoffrey Goodwell and arrested him on March 29, 2026.

On April 15, 2026, officers located and arrested 30-year-old Luis Ruiz and 36-year-old Elvira Ulloa in the area of 35th Street and National Avenue. Both were processed, interviewed, and booked into county jail.

Investigators are still working to identify the fourth person in the group. He is described as a Hispanic male in his 20's with a medium build.
