

**CONSTRUCTION NOTICE:
Pipeline Tie-In at West Morena Boulevard**

Please note that a correction is being issued regarding the construction notice previously distributed. The correct information is as follows: Work will take place on the northbound lane between Vega Street and Morena Boulevard. On Monday, April 27, the northbound lane will be closed as crews connect the final pipeline tie-in point, completing the Southern pipeline segment. Work to complete the tie in will take approximately four days, and once completed, crews will pave the immediate work area in advance of future paving.

Daytime work will occur between 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. During non-working hours, the northbound lane will remain closed due to the scope of work and the deep trench extending into both northbound lanes. While crews are on site, typical construction noise may be present. Throughout the project, crews will maintain a clean work zone to minimize dust leaving the area.

For the safety of the public and workers, traffic control measures will be in place throughout the work zone. Residents and commuters are asked to follow all posted signage, exercise caution, and adhere to traffic control directions. On-street parking will be restricted for the duration of the work. Due to the scale of this week-long operation, delays in the area are anticipated. Please allow extra travel time and plan commutes accordingly.

Please be advised that rain and inclement weather may impact the project schedule. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we make progress on this important project. We sincerely appreciate your patience and cooperation as we work to complete this critical infrastructure project for our community.

Why:
