

**CONSTRUCTION NOTICE:  
Pipeline Tie-In at Clairemont Drive and Erie St.**

Construction for the Morena Conveyance South & Middle and Morena Conveyance Bike Lanes Project is progressing. Work continues on the westbound lane of Clairemont Drive between Denver Street and Erie Street. On Thursday, April 23, crews will be working on connecting the remaining Middle pipeline segment. This critical connection unifies the Middle and Southern segments into a continuous system that will help strengthen and secure a local, drought-resilient water supply for San Diegans. Work to complete the tie in will take approximately four days, and once completed, crews will pave the immediate work area in advance of future paving.

Daytime work hours will take place between 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. All work will take place behind the barricades of the work zone to ensure the safety of the public and crews while working. While crews are working, typical noise associated with construction may be heard. Throughout this work, crews will maintain the cleanliness of the work zone to minimize any dust leaving.

For the safety of the public and workers, traffic control measures will be in place throughout the work zone. Residents and commuters are asked to follow all posted signage, exercise caution, and adhere to traffic control directions. Due to the scale of this four-day operation, delays in the area are anticipated. Please allow extra travel time and plan commutes accordingly.
