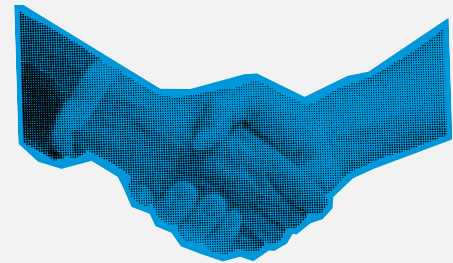


Can I still join a YC Meeting if I am not a part of the committee?

UNDERSTANDING & COMPARING YOUR FINANCIAL AID AWARD LETTERS

MARCH 2026

Reality Changers prepares youth to become first-generation college graduates and agents of change in their communities.

Spring is in the air—and just like March Madness, it’s decision time! As college acceptance letters and financial aid award letters roll in, it’s time to strategize and make your winning move. In this issue, we’ll break down what to do next: how to review and compare your financial aid offers, maximize scholarships and grants, and confidently commit to your final school of choice. We’ll also spotlight key scholarship opportunities and feature a career highlight to help you plan your next big win beyond graduation

Below is a practical guide to help students and families evaluate offers wisely and confidently.

Step 1: Understanding Your Award Letter

Financial aid letters outline the Cost of Attendance (COA) and the aid offered but formats vary.

COA Includes:

- Books & supplies
- Transportation & personal expenses
- Tuition & fees
- Housing and meals

Type of Aid:

- Grants & scholarships (gift aid, no repayment)
- Work-study (campus environment)
- Loans (must be repaid with interest)

Remember: Loans are not free money.

Step 2: Focus on Net Cost

Don’t be distracted by the “total aid” number if it includes loans.

Net Cost = COA – Grants & Scholarships (gift aid only) This is what you actually owe.

Step 3: Compare Schools Side-by-Side

Create a simple chart listing:

- Cost of Attendance
- Work-Study
- Net Cost
- Gift Aid
- Loans

Step 4: Think Beyond Year One

- Is aid renewable?
- What GPA is required?
- Will tuition increase?
- Is housing guaranteed?

Understand the full four-year financial picture.

Step 5: Review Loans Carefully

- Subsidized: Government pays interest while in school (best option).
- Unsubsidized: Interest accrues immediately
- Parent PLUS/Private: Credit-based, higher rates. Borrow only what you truly need.

Step 6: Appeal If Needed

You can request reconsideration if:

- Family finances change
- another school offered more
- FAFSA/CSS error occurred

Be professional and provide documentation. Seek support from a counselor or mentor.

Step 7: Consider Value, Not Just Price

Look at:

- Graduation Rates
- Job placement
- Internships & Academic fit
- Campus Support

Sometimes the best investment isn’t the lowest price.

Final Thoughts

Before Committing:

- Calculate your true net cost
- Compare offers clearly
- Minimize loans
- Ask Questions
- Think long-term

Your college decision shapes not just the next four years but your financial future.
