- 1 virtual public comment:
 - Tanner Marino: urged the Board's opposition to Assembly Bill 1043, which is claimed to implement age tracking features into every device and application.

Item 5: Action Item: Board discussion, and possible vote or other action regarding Guide for Complying with the TRUST Ordinance.

- Board comments:
 - Ike: institutional knowledge helped draft this, intended to be generic.
 - Matt: important to be prescriptive.
 - Joann: has challenges with certain sections, seems to repeat ordinance.
 - Ted: the more details, the better.
 - Tim: this is V1, a work in progress.
- Tim motions for distribution, Ike seconds. Board votes 6-0 in favor.

Item 6: Informational Item: Report from Committees:

- 1 in-person public comment:
 - Seth Hall: TRUST is still researching PD's Annual Surveillance Report in detail and will have communications with the PAB soon. There is a concerning level of detail in the ALPR Use Policy changes, such as behavior and time of day. Why is this the superior approach to the prior PAB process?
- No virtual public comment.
- Updates are:
 - Reviewing San Diego Police Department's Annual Surveillance Reports for existing 54 surveillance technologies
 - Tim: PD continues to be open to suggestions, not the end of the conversation.
 - Ike: met with PD on procedures, offered corrective information; comments PD on better info and auditing.
 - Reviewing San Diego Police Department's: 1. Proposed Surveillance Use Policy for the Tactical Custom Armored Track Loader ("TAC-CAT"); 2. Proposed Surveillance Impact Report for the TAC-CAT.

- Matt: will have updates soon.
- Audit Committee
 - Tim: met with PD on ALPR, focused on auditing.
 - Ike: Lee ran the show; covered risk matrix; “who watches the watchmen”; focus on stories behind the numbers, scrutinize the data.
- Reviewing San Diego Fire-Rescue’s Annual Surveillance Report
 - Tim: in progress, Lee to have updates at next meeting.
- Training Committee
 - Tim: Maggie leads, compliance manual was biggest product.
