<b>2. Where is your suggested project located?</b>	Extension of Carroll Canyon Road west from Camino Santa Fe to Interstate 805. This is the "missing link" that is the City's responsibility from Camino Santa Fe west to the existing Carroll Canyon Road	In the new Bruce Brown Community Park being constructed by the 3Roots Development on the south side of Carroll Canyon Road, east of Camino Santa Fe.	Within Mira Mesa Community
<b>3. How will this project positively impact the community?</b>	3Roots development will bring 1,800 homes to Mira Mesa, with Stonecreek adding another potential 4,450 homes. The extension of Carroll Canyon Road will allow for a much needed east-west thoroughfare in Mira Mesa.	The development of the 3Roots project also includes the development of Mira Mesa's second community park. The developer will construct the park and associated amenities, absent a new recreation center. While land will be set aside, the responsibility to fund and construct the recreation center falls to the City. It would be appropriate to time the construction of the recreation center to coincide with the development of the park, or shortly thereafter, to ensure residents have the ability to enjoy all the park has to offer.	The current Mira Mesa Library opened in 1994 and is 20,000 square feet. Sitting in the heart of our community, it provides valuable resources to the nearly 80,000 residents that call Mira Mesa home. Unfortunately, this library will not be able to solely provide the amenities without an additional library in Mira Mesa. According to the San Diego Public Library Master Plan Framework, A branch library space planning target of 0.35 to 0.45 square feet per capita would provide expanded capacity for people, programs, technology, and collections in San Diego. At full buildout, the Mira Mesa library would account for 0.14 square fee per capita.

The Mira Mesa Community Plan update identifies the need for a new fire station near Camino Santa Fe and Miramar Road. Given the growth in population, particularly on the western end of Mira Mesa, appropriate funding must begin to be set aside to identify a parcel and begin the process to purchase the site.	The Mira Mesa Community Plan Update states, "The Community Plan envisions expanding personal mobility options for Mira Mesa residents, employees, and visitors alike and promoting a safe and sustainable transportation system that meets the needs of people of all ages and abilities." To that end, the Plan identifies various mobility improvements in Appendix A that would help achieve this goal. We believe the City needs to properly plan and allocate an appropriate level of funding to begin implementation of these strategies sooner, rather than later. This includes, as a priority, the funding of bike lanes along Camino Santa Fe from Carroll Road to Miramar Road, as well as Class IV protected bike lanes along Mira Mesa Blvd between Camino Santa Fe and Camino Ruiz.	The Canyon Hills Resource Park project provides for the design and construction of neighborhood park amenities. This includes picnic areas, interpretive signs, benches, and landscaping and walking paths. The site was purchased for a park in 1989. While the GDP has been adopted, funding for park improvements have yet to be allocated.	We support the next steps needed to begin construction of Phase 2 of Mira Mesa Community Park, and do not believe the project should be delayed. We also believe either an expansion, or replacement, of the recreation center is needed. We believe a feasibility analysis should be completed to determine the cost to either expand or replace the current recreation center. Again, this effort should not delay the current Phase 2 projects, as our community has waited decades for this project to be completed.
