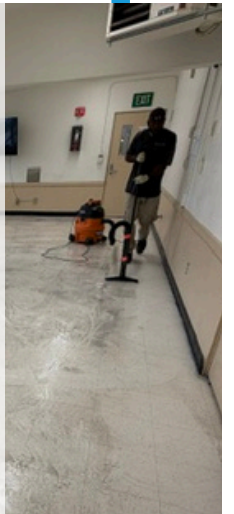

# RUFFIN CANYON RIBBON CUTTING

## *Improvements Connecting Serra Mesa and Mission Valley*



On Friday, April 17, Councilmember Raul Campillo joined representatives from the City of San Diego and community organizations to celebrate improvements made to Ruffin Canyon that provide a new connection between Serra Mesa and Mission Valley. The canyon upgrades, which were over 10 years in the making, were completed through a partnership with the City of San Diego Park Rangers, the San Diego Mountain Biking Association, Friends of Ruffin Canyon and San Diego Canyonlands.

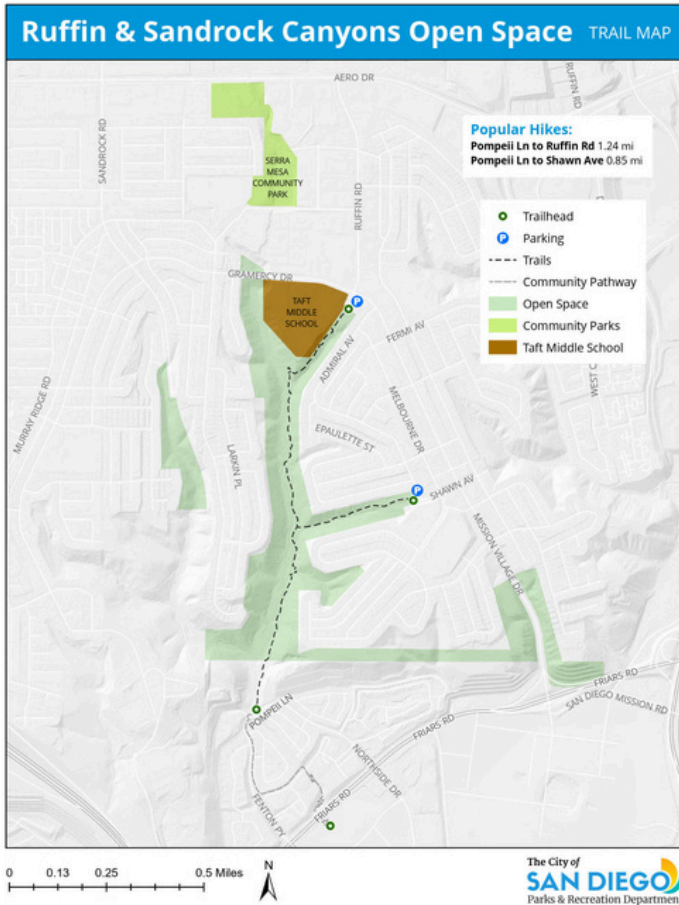

## Improvements Connecting Serra Mesa and Mission Valley



Before the upgrades, it was nearly impossible for hikers and canyon users to safely traverse between the two neighborhoods. Work to make the connection included the installation of three wooden footbridges, relocating a portion of the trails from the cobble bottom to the side of the canyon and restoring a portion of the wetlands. These improvements provide greater access to San Diegans who want to take a hike through the middle of the City in one of San Diego's many urban canyons.

A new trailhead was opened within the Escala community located just north of Friars Road. While the community is gated, a public access tunnel under Friars Road provides all trail users access to the community during daylight hours from the Fenton Marketplace shopping center. On May 23, South Bay Recreation Center hosted I Love My Park Day, an annual event showcasing recreation centers, community resources, live entertainment, food, crafts, rock walls, inflatables, game trucks, music, a petting zoo, pony rides, games, and free family fun. This year's event also featured new volleyball and soccer tournaments, and Mayor Todd Gloria helped kick off the day. Approximately 2,500 people attended.

## Willie Henderson Sports Complex



### Willie Henderson Sports Complex

The new basketball courts officially opened to the community on May 17, with 85 people in attendance. This project was a collaboration between the City of San Diego, San Diego Football Club, the Prebys Foundation, and the San Diego Parks Foundation to create a safe, modern space for basketball and futsal. The renovation included a new subfloor, updated top layers, fresh artwork, and new basketball standards. The project was completed in under seven months from start to finish.

# SAN DIEGO PARKS FOUNDATION

## *Fanuel Street Park*



### **Fanuel Street Park**

Over 60 people came together on May 22 for the ribbon cutting of a new playground structure and stationary sand play. This was a collaboration between the City of San Diego, the San Diego Parks Foundation, ZOOM Recreation and donations from community members to create a new a safe space for children and families. The community had requested a new structure over two years ago due to King Tides destroying the old structure. We were approached by the City and the community in September of 2025. Together we were able to accomplish this in eight months.

# ASSET MANAGEMENT

## *Fanuel Street Park Playground Replacement*



After nearly two years without a play structure, Fanuel Street Park in Pacific Beach has officially reopened with a new inclusive playground, restoring a valued community gathering space along Mission Bay.

The former play structure was removed in 2024 after severe corrosion and deterioration caused by prolonged exposure to the coastal environment and king tide impacts. For many Pacific Beach families, the closure represented the loss of a long-time neighborhood destination where generations of children had played.

Construction on the new playground began in early May 2026 and was completed in time for the Memorial Day season. Through a collaborative public-private partnership, the project moved from groundbreaking to completion in just a few weeks.



## *Fanuel Street Park Playground Replacement*

The project included the installation of a new play structure, updated safety surfacing, and new sand play elements designed to create a more engaging and accessible experience for children of all abilities. The playground also incorporates ADA-compliant and toddler-focused play features that support inclusive recreation and developmental play opportunities for younger visitors.

The project was made possible through a collaborative partnership between Parks and Recreation, the San Diego Parks Foundation, and Zoom Recreation, which donated and installed the new playground equipment. The San Diego Parks Foundation generously covered the cost of the PlayMatta safety surfacing. Parks and Recreation is utilizing the PlayMatta system for the first time in response to updated California Coastal Commission requirements, which no longer permit poured-in-place rubber surfacing in coastal zones.



The new playground equipment was specifically selected for the harsh coastal environment and is constructed from heavy-duty recycled plastic designed to better withstand salt air and corrosion along Mission Bay. The effort reflects the growing emphasis on public-private partnerships and evolving material standards to improve neighborhood parks and recreational amenities throughout San Diego.

Community members, Council President LaCava, District 2 staff, and Parks and Recreation celebrated the reopening during a ribbon-cutting event at the park on May 22. The renovated playground is expected to help revitalize Fanuel Street Park and provide a safer, more welcoming environment for families visiting Mission Bay.

With its new playground, Fanuel Street Park continues to serve as an important link along Mission Bay for residents and visitors alike, bringing new energy and play opportunities to the Pacific Beach community.

# PARK RANGER DIVISION

## *Ocean Beach Planting Restoration Event*



On May 15, City of San Diego Park Rangers from across the department came together to support the natural dune habitat restoration project at the Ocean Beach Dog Park. Ocean Beach is home to a rich variety of native coastal plants, and Park Rangers helped plant more than 35 new natives, remove invasive weeds, and clean up the Native Plant Garden.

This work is part of the Ocean Beach Estuary Enhancement Project, a partnership with San Diego Bird Alliance, San Diego River Park Foundation, Urban Corps of San Diego, and several local conservation groups. Together, these organizations are working to restore and beautify the coastal dune habitat and return it to a more natural state, reducing the impacts of both human and dog activity.

Among the plants added during this event were lemonade berry, laurel sumac, and California sagebrush. These native species play a crucial role in stabilizing dunes, providing habitat and food for local pollinators, reducing erosion, and discouraging off-trail foot traffic that can further damage the sensitive dune ecosystem.

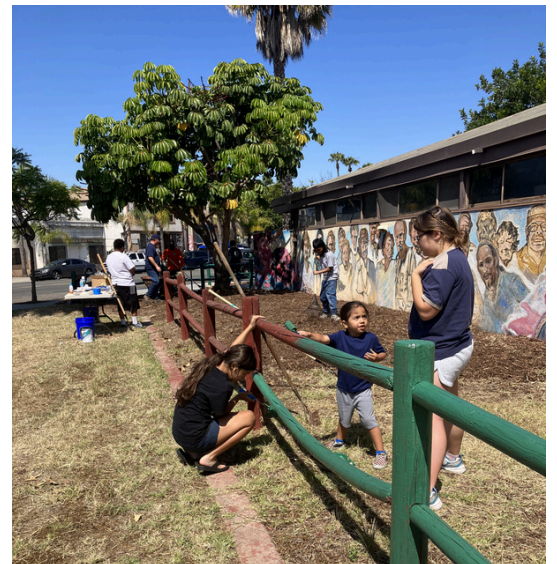

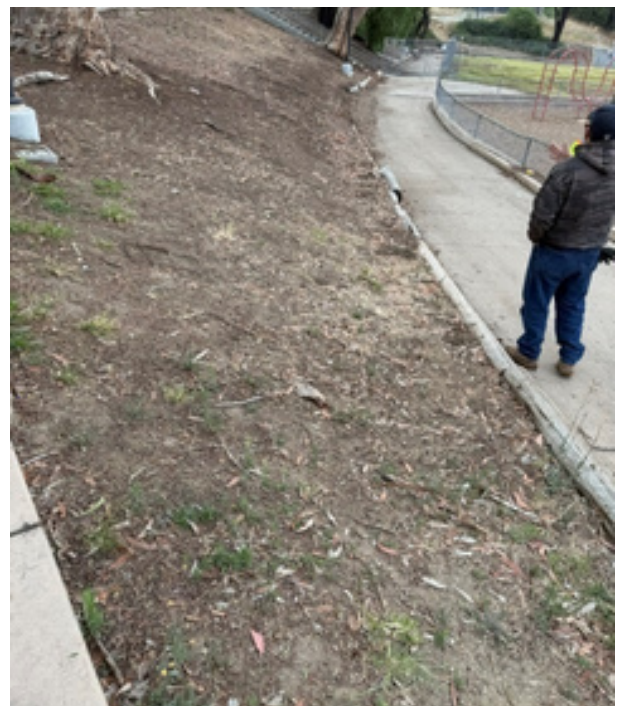
## *Enhancement at Encanto Community Park*

The Encanto Area team recently completed several major enhancement projects at Encanto Recreation Center and Community Park.

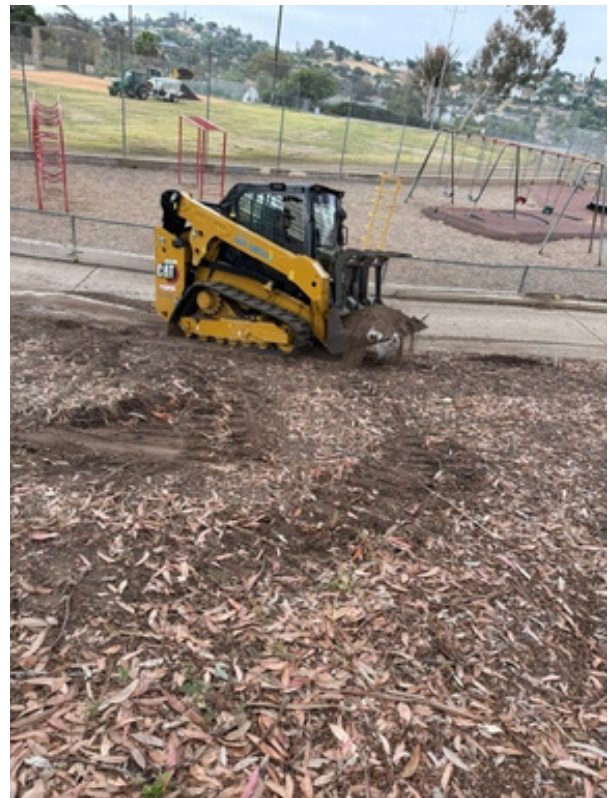
