## **Infant from May 30<sup>th</sup> Domestic Violence Homicide Has Died**

**San Diego** - On May 30, 2026, at approximately 1:10 a.m., San Diego Police Department Dispatch received multiple 9-1-1 calls reporting a shooting in the 4900 block of Gardena Avenue.

Officers arrived within minutes and located a 17-year-old female suffering from a gunshot wound to the head. The victim, who was approximately 32 weeks pregnant, was found unresponsive. Officers immediately initiated life-saving measures for both the victim and her unborn child. Paramedics transported the female to a local hospital where an emergency cesarean section was performed. The newborn was in critical condition. Despite life-saving efforts, the mother died at the hospital.

Homicide detectives assumed responsibility for the investigation. They have since learned the victim and several family members were visiting San Diego from Arizona and staying in a short-term vacation rental. The victim's 21-year-old boyfriend, also from Arizona, had traveled to San Diego separately and met up with the victim outside the rental, where he shot her. Following the shooting, the suspect fled on foot to a nearby canyon.

At approximately 3:00 a.m., officers located the suspect hiding near 4900 September Street. The suspect, identified as 19-year-old Trevon Williams, was taken into custody without incident. A semi-automatic handgun was recovered at the time of his arrest. Williams was booked into San Diego County Jail for murder.

On June 7, the newborn, who had suffered a severe hypoxic brain injury, passed away. The San Diego Police Department extends its sincere appreciation to the neonatal intensive care unit staff at Rady Children's Hospital for the care they provided and their extraordinary efforts to save her life.
