Hi Neighbors,

I want to begin by addressing yesterday's horrific act of violence at the Islamic Center of San Diego. My heart is with every victim, every grieving family, and with San Diego's Muslim community as our city mourns those who were lost.

Teachers, children, and people of faith who gathered in peace were instead met by armed cowards who terrorized not only a place of worship, but a school filled with children. We should call this what it is: hate.

Islamophobia — along with other forms of hate, racism, and extremism — leads to violence when it is allowed to spread unchecked. San Diego must stand united in rejecting these hateful ideologies without compromise and without exception.

I want to especially acknowledge Amin Abdullah, who was a security guard at the Islamic Center. He placed himself between the shooters and the people in his care. SDPD Chief Wahl praised Amin's actions as "heroic" and noted that he "undoubtedly saved lives." Because of his courage, people who may not have made it home that day did. He gave children the chance to be reunited with their parents. That debt can never be repaid.

I also want to thank our first responders from SDPD, numerous local law enforcement agencies across the region, and medical professionals who acted quickly and courageously to protect, care for, and support the community.

These heroes showed the real San Diego.

We will not be deterred from exercising our right to live in a city where every person — regardless of faith, race, or background — can live, worship, and raise their children without fear.

## District 6 Spay-Neuter Event



## Unclaimed Monies Report

The City of San Diego is reaching out to businesses and individuals who may be owed refunds or vendor payments. More than 900 businesses and individuals are eligible for unclaimed monies, and the deadline to submit claims is fast approaching.

Unclaimed monies are refund or vendor payments issued by the City that remain uncashed. Reasons checks are not cashed include misplaced checks, outdated mailing addresses, and business closures or mergers. In some cases, recipients may simply forget to deposit a check.

People and businesses are encouraged to visit the portal at [sandiego.gov/finance/unclaimed](https://sandiego.gov/finance/unclaimed) and search by name or business name.

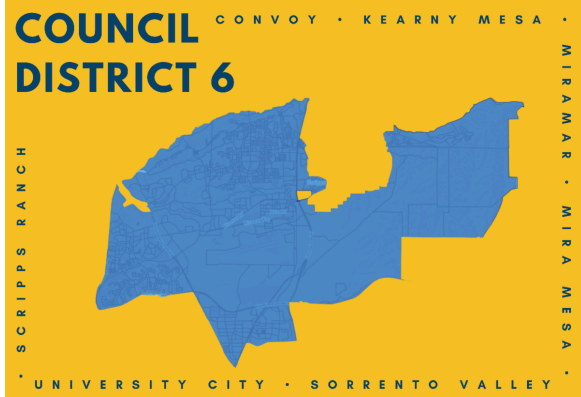
