CONSTRUCTION NOTICE: Final Paving Along Genesee Avenue between Governor Drive and Appleton Street

On the Morena Northern Tunnels and Pipeline project, crews have completed installation of the 48-inch and 30-inch pipelines, along with the base repairs needed for final paving.

Final Paving and Restoration

Beginning Friday, June 19, crews will pave along Genesee Avenue, starting from Governor Drive and working south toward Appleton Street. Crews will start in the outside lanes near Calgary Avenue and head south, then reverse direction at Appleton Street and pave north toward Calgary Avenue. After completing the outside lanes, crews will pave the inside lanes in both directions.

Crews will first grind the roadway with heavy equipment, then apply a new layer of asphalt. Work will take place at night from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. through June 28. Traffic control measures will remain in place throughout the work zone, and on-site crews will help guide vehicles through intersections as needed.

What to Expect:

- Increased noise and dust are expected throughout the duration of the grinding and paving work.
- Electronic message boards will provide advance notice of traffic control changes.
- Parking restrictions will be enforced. Please do not park in posted no-parking areas; vehicles in violation will be towed.
- Access for emergency vehicles, residents, and businesses will be maintained at all times.
- Please expect traffic delays and construction noise during work hours.
- For your safety, please follow all posted signs and traffic detours.

The City and project team are committed to completing construction as safely and efficiently as possible, and the University City community's patience and coordination are appreciated. Please note that construction schedules are subject to change at any time.

Why: Pure Water San Diego is the City of San Diego's advanced water purification program that will provide nearly half of San Diego's water supply locally by 2035 and significantly reduce treated discharges from the Point Loma Wastewater Treatment Plant. Pure Water San Diego will use proven water purification technology to clean recycled water to produce safe, high-quality drinking water.

The phased, multi-year program offers a cost-effective investment for San Diego's water and wastewater needs. San Diegans are getting dual value from this investment — reliable, sustainable drinking water and avoided wastewater costs. The Morena Northern Pipelines and Tunnels project is one of several major water infrastructure projects in Phase 1 of Pure Water San Diego.

The City is committed to clear communication and providing up-to-date information about construction activities. Properties along the construction area will receive printed notices before work begins near their address, and construction notices will be regularly posted on utc.purewatersd.org.
