San Diego Climate Week creates space for collaboration, education, and action that accelerates local climate solutions and strengthens resilience in our communities.

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

San Diego is experiencing the escalating effects of climate change: extreme heat, rising sea levels, poor air quality, and environmental injustice (particularly as a border region). Public awareness and coordinated community action are weak & fragmented. Frontline communities disproportionately bear the brunt of climate impacts and are left out of policy and decision-making processes. San Diego has an urgent need for inclusive, place-based climate engagement that connects diverse sectors & empowers residents, businesses and politicians to take action.

HOW DOES SDCW HELP?

By convening a diverse ecosystem of partners, from community groups to government agencies, we foster accessible, justice-centered opportunities for learning, connection, and collective impact. Every event is designed to move conversations forward with actionable outcomes that will equip communities with the knowledge, resources, and networks needed to empower us all to be a part of San Diego's climate future. We envision a region where collective climate action is led by shared knowledge, environmental justice, and meaningful collaboration. San Diego Climate Week strives to be a catalyst of equitable solutions by uplifting local leadership, supporting science-based approaches, and ensuring that everyone has the opportunity to participate in shaping a climate-resilient and inclusive future.

By focusing on both local action to address the climate crisis and global solutions for climate change, SDCW unites the region to create a more resilient and inclusive future.

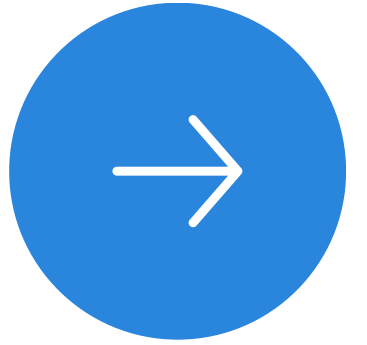
MISSION

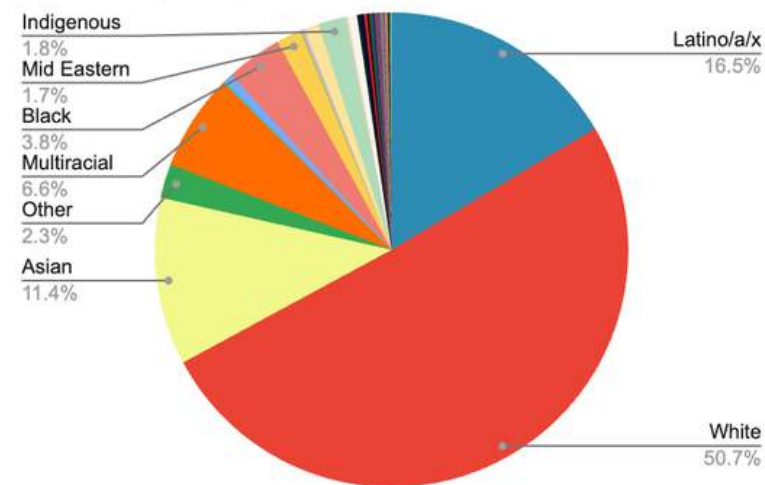

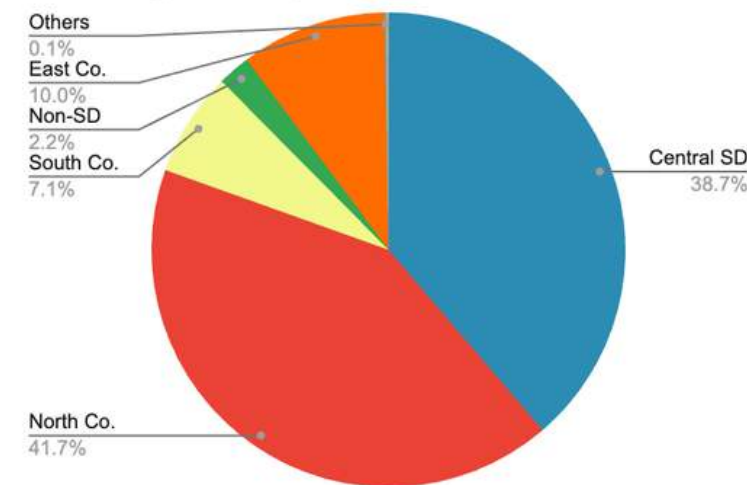

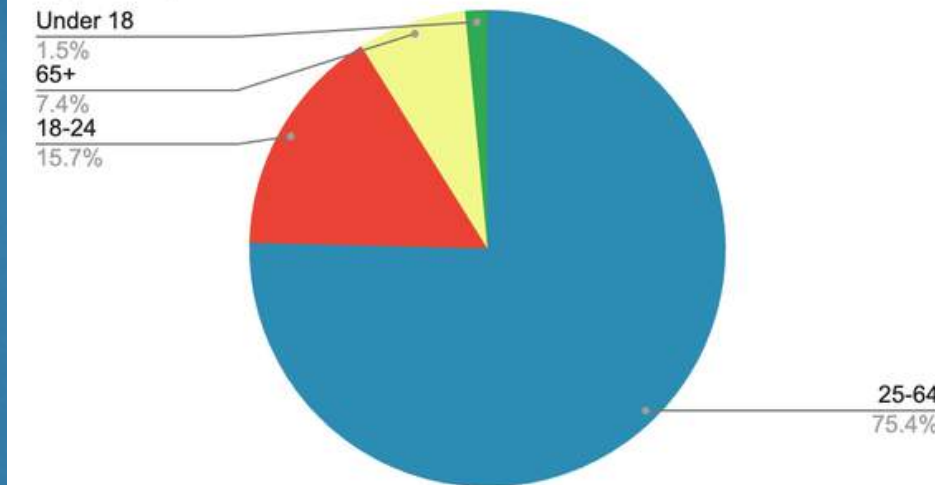
Ethnicity Representation



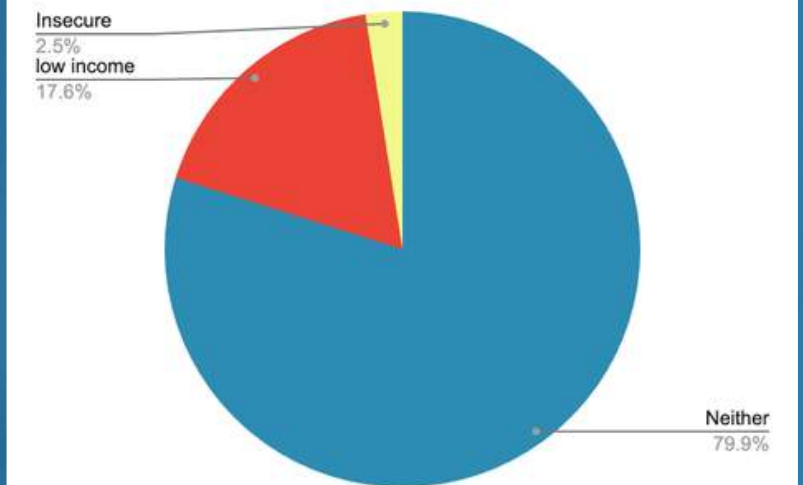
SD Region Representation



Age Representation

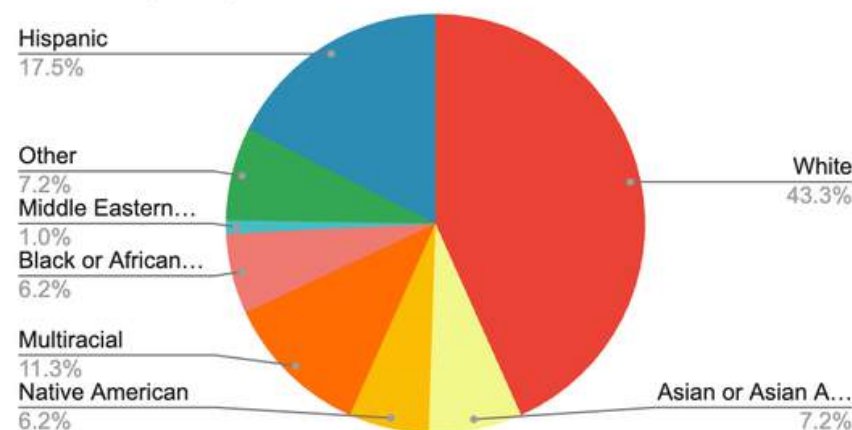


Socioeconomic Representation

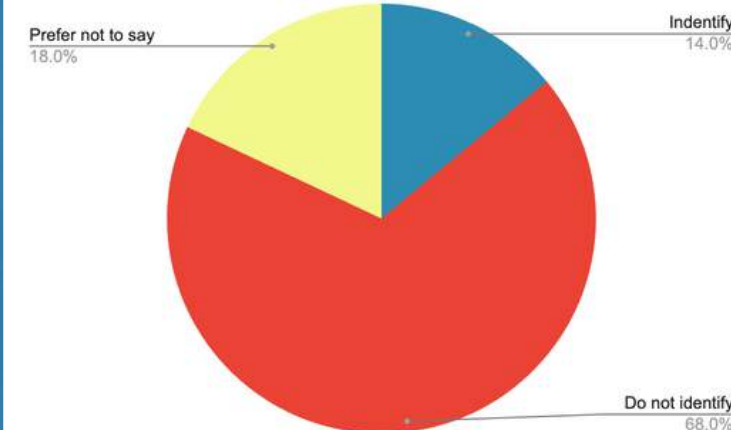

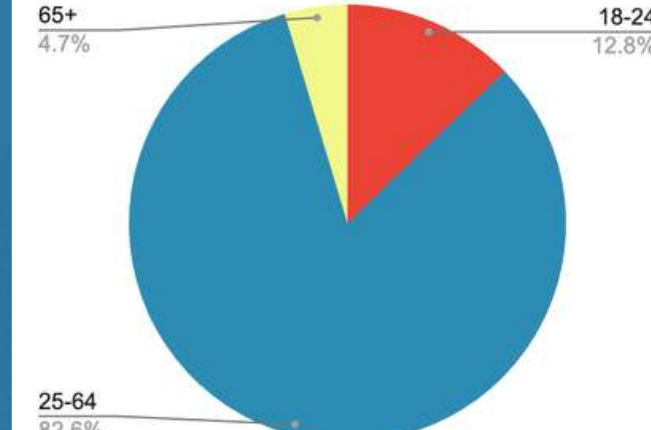

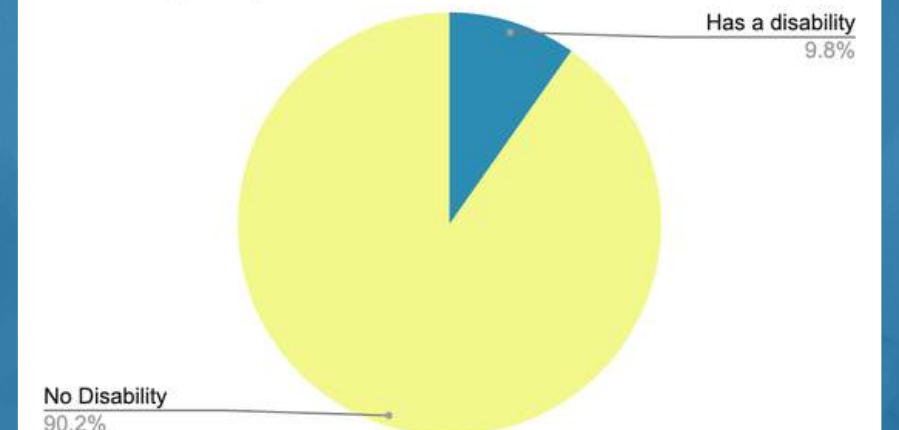

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Theme 2: Accelerating "Net-Neutral" and Mobility Wins

Objective: Identify and fast-track "low-hanging fruit" projects that drive emissions reductions without significant budget strain.

- Transportation remains the largest source of emissions.
- Focusing on already budgeted projects—such as the Florida Avenue roundabout or safer street initiatives—can effect immediate change
- There is a need to expand measures that specifically improve public transit ridership.

Impact Highlight: SDCW can attract global attention and companies to San Diego, functioning as a tourism and economic vehicle for climate-forward policy.
