NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit - Pacific Islander Festival

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Mission Bay Park

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 2

LOCATION: 3150 Ingraham Street, Ski Beach Park, Sun Runner Lot, Hospitality Point, Vacation Village

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a two-day cultural festival that would include onsite food preparation, food and merchandise vendors, craft vendors, portable restrooms, recycling/trash containers, tables, chairs, canopies, stages, generators, sound amplification, music and entertainment, and fencing and/or barriers that would occur at Ski Beach Park, Vacation Village, Sun Runner Lot, and Hospitality Point in Mission Bay Park on September 26 & 27, 2026. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 8 AM on September 23, 2026, until 2 PM on September 28, 2026. Set-up would occur from 8 AM until 6 PM on September 23 & 24, 2026, and from 7 AM until 7 PM on September 25, 2026. The event would occur on September 26 & 27, 2026, from 8 AM until 5 PM, and dismantling would occur on September 28, 2026, from 6 AM until 2 PM. Approximately 35,000 attendees are anticipated on each day of the event. See attached map.

No road closures would be associated with the event. Parking closures would be associated with the event and would include the north Ski Beach parking lot from 8 AM on September 23, 2026, until 12 PM on September 27, 2026, and the south Ski Beach parking lot from 8 AM on September 25, 2026, until 12 PM on September 27, 2026.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use

of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

The appeal filing fee must be United States Postal Service (USPS) postmarked) before or on the final date of the appeal.
