NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit - La Jolla Art & Wine Festival 2026

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: La Jolla

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 1

LOCATION: 7808 Girard Avenue, Girard Avenue, Wall Street, and Silverado Street (see attached map)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a two-day art and wine festival event on the subject streets (see attached map) on October 10 and 11, 2026. The event would include artwork, a family art center, a fenced-in wine/spirit/beer garden, food trucks, alcohol, onsite food preparation, vendors, stages, generators, sound amplification, fencing and/or barriers, entertainment, dog rescues & adoption section, portable restrooms, canopies, tables, chairs, and recycle/trash containers. Alcohol service would occur on October 10 and 11, 2026, from 10 AM until 6 PM. Noise associated with the event including set-up and dismantling would occur from October 9, 2026, at 12 PM until October 12, 2026, at 6 AM. Set-up would occur from 12 PM until 12 AM on October 9, 2026, from 12 AM until 10 AM on October 10, 2026, and from 7 AM until 10 AM on October 11, 2026. The two-day event would occur on October 10 and 11, 2026, from 10 AM until 6:30 PM. Dismantling would occur from 6:30 PM on October 11, 2026, until 6 AM on October 12, 2026. Approximately 10,000 attendees are anticipated on each day of the event.

Road closures associated with the event would occur during the following times:

- From 12 PM on October 9, 2026, until 6 AM on October 12, 2026:
 - Girard Avenue between Wall Street and Silverado Street
- From 3 PM on October 9, 2026, until 6 AM on October 12, 2026:
 - Girard Avenue between Prospect Street and Wall Street
 - Girard Avenue between Silverado Street and Torrey Pines Road
 - Wall Street between Herschel Avenue and Girard Avenue
 - Silverado Street between Herschel Avenue and Faye Avenue

Additional parking closures associated with the event would occur from 3 PM on October 9, 2026, until 6 AM on October 12, 2026, and would include:

- Approximately five (5) spaces on Herschel Avenue between Prospect Street and Wall Street
- Kline Street between Herschel Avenue and Faye Avenue

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

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On September 15, 2026, the City of San Diego made the above-referenced environmental determination pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 5 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice **(September 22, 2026)**.

The appeal filing fee must be United States Postal Service (USPS) postmarked) before or on the final date of the appeal.

Bring the fully completed appeal application DS-3031 (including grounds for appeal and supporting documentation) to the City Administration Building— Public Information Counter (Open 8:00am to 5:00pm Monday through Friday excluding City approved holidays), 1st Floor Lobby, located at 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101, by 5:00pm on the last day of the appeal period. The completed appeal form shall include the required appeal fee, with a check payable to: City Treasurer.
