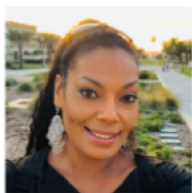

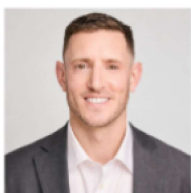

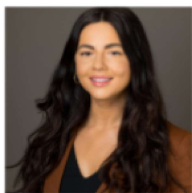

Work Plan Objectives

This Annual Report is aligned with the [2026 Work Plan](#) which has the following Objectives:

Objective	Focus	What is currently included
1. Governance	Strengthen CAB Governance, Effectiveness, and Accountability	Tracks attendance and quorum expectations, agenda planning, workplan and annual report processes, coordination with related boards, stakeholder engagement, and educational briefings.
2. Building Decarbonization	Advance Equitable Building Decarbonization	Covers building benchmarking, Building Performance Standards, reach codes, HEART program learnings, alignment with CAP targets, SB 1221 neighborhood decarbonization pilots, and equity implications.
3. Mobility	Elevate Equitable Mobility and Mode Shift	Covers coordination with the Mobility Board and mobility organizations, the Bicycle Master Plan, Street Design Manual, parking-demand management, CAP mode-shift strategies, CIP prioritization, and the Bike Share Feasibility Study.
4. Additional CAP Strategies	Support Additional CAP Strategies	Designed to capture opportunistic CAB engagement outside its highest-priority areas.
5. Climate Equity Fund	Elevate the Climate Equity Fund	Tracks CAB advocacy for restoring CEF funding, a requested staff presentation on the fund's history and expenditures, alignment with the Climate Equity Working Group, and recommendations concerning community benefits and accountability.
6. CAP Transparency	Improve CAP Transparency and Public Understanding	Tracks dashboard usability, public communication of CAP progress and tradeoffs, documentation of implementation risks and gaps, and future consultation on the CAP update.

Key Activities & Recommendations

This section discusses each Objective and provides a summary of key activities and recommendations.

Objective 1: Strengthen CAB Governance, Effectiveness, and Accountability

Focus on improving CAB operations to increase its impact.

Key Activities

- Adopted the 2026 Climate Advisory Board Work Plan to establish strategic priorities and guide the Board's work.
- Focused on reducing board meeting adjournments due to lack of quorum
 - Established Board Secretary position to improve board member attendance
- Established monthly planning meeting with Board officers and staff liaison
- Established coordination with related City boards
 - Identified liaisons who provide "Reports on Related Boards" as recurring board agenda item
 - Established quarterly meetings of Board leaders
 - Adopted several letters of support for relevant activities by other boards
- Established an expectation that Board members identify and recommend community speakers on topics relevant to the Board's work

Objective 2: Advance Equitable Building Decarbonization

Buildings remain one of the City's largest emissions reduction opportunities, with significant equity implications. The Board focused on practical implementation strategies that could accelerate building decarbonization while maximizing community benefits and recognizing fiscal realities.

Key Activities

- Aligned with staff on relevant activities and timing for board engagement

- Urged the city to accelerate high-impact actions in buildings
- Monitored implementation of the City's building-related climate strategies and opportunities to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- Invited the [San Diego Regional Energy Network](#) to present on their new programs, including those aligned with building decarbonization

Objective 3: Elevate Equitable Mobility & Mode Shift

The Board worked collaboratively with the Mobility Board and community partners to support initiatives that advance Climate Action Plan implementation while improving mobility options for San Diego residents.

Key Activities

- Received presentations on the CicloSDias Pilot Program and a Potential regional, docked e-bike share network
- Monitored implementation of the City's mobility-related climate strategies and opportunities to reduce transportation-related greenhouse gas emissions.
- Coordinated with the Mobility Board on issues of shared interest

Objective 4: Support Work on Additional Climate Strategies

The Board engaged selectively on additional CAP strategies based on member capacity and community interest.

Key Activities

- Received presentations on additional climate strategies
 - Plant-Based Climate Action Initiatives from SanDiego350
 - San Diego Zoo Wildlife Alliance Sustainability Strategy and Alignment with the City Climate Action Plan
 - Public Power Feasibility Study, Phase 2
 - WILDCOAST, which addresses climate change through natural solutions
- Received staff & board announcements on regional activities aligned with the CAP strategies
- Maintained flexibility to address emerging climate issues as they arose during the reporting period.

Objective 5: Monitor and Elevate the Climate Equity Fund

The Board sought to ensure that equity remained a guiding principle across Climate Action Plan implementation, in addition to monitoring the [Climate Equity Fund](#).

Key Activities

- Encouraged continued transparency regarding Climate Equity Fund planning, funding, and implementation.
- Considered how climate programs can provide multiple benefits, including improved public health, lower energy costs, increased resilience, and expanded access to clean energy and transportation

Objective 6: Improve CAP Transparency and Public Understanding

Key Activities

- Received regular updates from City staff on implementation of the Climate Action Plan.
- Received a presentation on the October 2026 San Diego Climate Week, with discussion for opportunities for the city and the board to engage with the public
- Developing recommendations for CAP Dashboard usability, transparency, accessibility, accountability, and public understanding

Key Priorities for the City ~~Action Going Forward~~

The Climate Advisory Board's recommendations during the reporting period consistently emphasized several priorities that will help advance implementation of the City's Climate Action Plan and maximize benefits for San Diego residents.

- **Accelerate Climate Action Plan Implementation.** Prioritize implementation of adopted Climate Action Plan measures that deliver measurable greenhouse gas reductions and meaningful community benefits while recognizing the City's fiscal constraints.
- **Improve Transparency and Accountability.** Strengthen public reporting on Climate Action Plan implementation by clearly communicating implementation schedules, funding, and milestones toward adopted goals. Transparent reporting supports informed decision-making, builds public trust, and helps identify implementation challenges early.
 - Ensure CAP 2027 changes to the Net-Zero Target Dates and Strategies are publicly available well in advance of developing the measures and actions
- **Advance Practical, High-Impact Climate Solutions.** Focus on actions that are technically feasible, cost-effective, and capable of delivering multiple benefits, including improved public health, lower energy costs, greater resilience, cleaner air, high-quality local jobs and workforce development opportunities and reduced greenhouse gas emissions. Recommendations include
 - Cost-effective reach codes for Single-Family AC to Heat Pump Replacements
 - City participation in SB 1221 Neighborhood Decarbonization Pilots, which redirects utility funds from aging gas pipeline replacements toward community-approved electrification projects
 - City development of a Building Performance Standards (BPS) policy
 - A regional, docked e-bike share program
- **Strengthen Climate Advisory Board Effectiveness.** Maintain a fully functioning advisory board by filling vacant Board seats in a timely manner and implementing SB 707 teleconferencing provisions to improve member recruitment, retention, participation, and public accessibility. A strong and diverse advisory board is better positioned to provide informed, consistent advice that supports the City's climate goals.

The Board remains committed to providing practical, evidence-based recommendations that support implementation of the Climate Action Plan and help the City achieve its adopted climate goals while delivering meaningful benefits for San Diego's communities .
