A Word on Community Planning Group Reform

Since 2018, the City Attorney, Independent City Auditor, Grand Jury, Audit Committee, and a variety of community leaders and organizations groups have weighed in on how CPGs should comply with the City Charter, our local constitution.

As a former Community Planning Group (CPG) Chair and Community Planners Committee (CPC) Chair, I am proud to be leading this reform. My proposed solution will maintain CPGs as advisory bodies to the City, retain the hundreds of volunteers and community leaders who serve, improve opportunities for broad community representation and transparency, and allow for an effective and supportive use of City resources.

I encourage your participation and feedback as we present this to Planning Commission, Land Use & Housing Council, and the full Council in early 2022. The first presentation was at Community Planners Committee (CPC) November 30th meeting.

This update establishes a community-wide goal of net zero by 2035, committing San Diego to an accelerated trajectory for greenhouse gas reductions. City staff is holding two public forums to introduce the plan, listen to public feedback, and share how to use the online draft. District 1 Gets it Done

This month, Team LaCava really stepped up as we returned to in-person events across the City. Please see below for a few of our most recent "community wins."

Carmel Valley

- Connected property owners with appropriate City staff to identify owners of land parcels off Carmel Creek Road and Valley Center Drive;
- Reconciled an error on a resident's water bill, which lead to a bill exemption;
- Completed vegetation abatement near a property line between Carmel Canyon Road and Tarantella Lane;
- Collaborated with the San Diego Police Department and local schools on various police reports regarding safety issues throughout the Carmel Valley and Pacific Highlands Ranch neighborhoods, including a recent increase in disruptive behavior at the Del Mar Highlands Town Center;
- Worked alongside the San Dieguito River Park Joint Powers Authority and Surf Cup Sports to begin restoration work on a portion of the Coast to Crest Trail. The event is scheduled for December 4, and my office will be volunteering from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. Those interested in volunteering or learning more can contact Executive Director Shawna Anderson at <u>shawna@sdrp.org</u>.

La Jolla

- Celebrated replanting seven trees at Goldfinch Point with Friends of Coast Walk Trail, LJ Sunrise Rotary Club, and The Cave Store;
- Honored veterans at the Mt. Soledad National War Memorial Veteran's Day Service;

- Toured proposed maintenance to the Picnic Grove at Scripps Park and resolved scheduling
- Joined "Pitch Your Passion" to hear teens share their concerns and suggestions for a better community;
- Spoke at the La Jolla Community Center's Community Forum on my priorities and answered questions;
- Facilitated the city regrading the alley in the 7400 block of High Avenue;
- Presented a plan for brush abatement in Pottery Canyon Park;
- Abated trash and dead brush from the hillsides along the Fay Avenue Bike Path;
- · Celebrated the Grand Opening of The Map in Kellogg Park;
- Kicked off the 13th Art & Wine Festival, benefiting underfunded programs like art, music, science, physical education, technology and on-site medical care at all La Jolla public schools;
- Obtained Police enforcement against illegal fires at Marine Street Beach.
- Presented a commendation to Scripps Institute of Oceanography for the launch of Scripps Ocean Atmosphere Research Simulator (SOARS.)
- Resolved traffic signal timing, inspired by The Children's School's 2nd Grade Class's research and analysis.

Torrey Hills

• Facilitated the planning of vegetation abatement work near Carmel Mountain Road and East Ocean Air Drive between the City's MAD Division and Torrey Hills community members.

University City

- Relayed several reports of missed trash collection in Villa La Jolla Park to City staff, resulting in immediate service;
- Ensured Gilman Drive was repaved after a utility line disrupted the street just south of the Via Alicante intersection;
- Connected residents with Traffic Engineering staff, who evaluated the intersection of Agee Street and Karensue Avenue for stop signs, ultimately deciding the intersection met criteria for installation;
- Facilitated the repair of a streetlight along Syracuse Court, which had been out for 9 months;
- · Worked with Development Services to clear a stalled electrical permit;
- Canvassed portions of University City to promote the University City Community Plan Update Community Survey.
