NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PLANNING DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit – SoCal Taco Fest

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Downtown

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3

LOCATION: Waterfront Park at 1600 Pacific Highway

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for temporary lane, sidewalk, and road closures within San Diego public right-of-way jurisdiction that would be associated with the SoCal Taco Fest 21 and over event that would occur on October 23, 2021. The event permit would be issued by the County. Lane/sidewalk closures within the City's jurisdiction would occur from 6 AM on October 21, 2021, until 2 AM on October 24, 2021, and would include one NB lane, the parking area, and the sidewalk on Harbor Drive between Ash and Grape, the access/frontage road on Harbor Drive between Hawthorne and Grape Streets, and one parking lane and the sidewalk of Grape Street between N. Harbor Drive and Pacific Highway. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/ dismantling would occur from 6 AM on October 21, 2021, until 2 AM on October 24, 2021. There would be one stage with entertainment and sound amplification would occur from 11 AM until 10 PM on October 23, 2021. On October 21-22, 2021, set-up would occur from 6 AM until 8 PM. On October 23, 2021, set-up would occur from 10 PM until 11 AM, the event would occur from 11 AM until 10 PM, and dismantling would occur from 10 PM until 12 Midnight. On October 24, 2021, dismantling would occur from 12:01 AM until 2 PM.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review and determined the project meets the categorical exemption criteria set forth in the CEQA State Guidelines: §Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; §Section 15304(e) (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent

effects on the environment; §Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use.

In addition, the exceptions set forth in the CEQA State Guidelines §15300.2 do not apply to this project wherein: a) the project would not impact an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped, and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; b) no cumulative impacts of successive projects of the same type in the same place were identified; c) there is no reasonable possibility that the project would have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances; d) the project would not result in damage to scenic resources, including but not limited to, trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources, within a highway officially designated as a state scenic highway; e) the project is not located on a site which is included on any list compiled pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code; and f) the project would not cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.

The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
- 2. Appeals filed via US Mail: Send the appeal by US Mail to City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. Appeals filed by US Mail must have a United States Postal Service (USPS) postmark by the appeal deadline to be considered valid. The appeal application can be obtained here. You must separately mail the required appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
