NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PROJECT NAME/NUMBER: Special Event Permit – 2021 Ocean Beach Holiday Parade

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Ocean Beach

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 2

LOCATION: Newport Ave, Abbot Street

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a community holiday parade that would occur on December 4, 2021 and include vehicles, marching units, floats and parade vehicles, bands, temporary use of a stage, tents, fencing and/or barriers, performance and amplified sound. The parade route would begin at Sunset Cliffs and Newport Avenue, travel down Newport Avenue, turn right onto Abbott Street, and turn right and disband on Santa Monica Avenue. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 3 PM until 11 PM on December 4, 2021. Set-up would occur from 3 PM until 5:00 PM, the parade event would occur from 5:00 PM until 7 PM, and dismantling would occur from 7 PM until 11 PM.

Road closures associated with the event would occur from 3 PM until 8 PM and would include Newport Avenue between Abbott Street and Froude Street, Santa Monica Avenue between Froude Street and Sunset Cliffs Boulevard, Ebers Street between Newport Avenue and Saratoga Streets, Santa Monica between Abbott and Bacon and Abbott Street between Newport and Santa Monica Avenues. Anticipated attendance is approximately 6000.

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: This action is exempt pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15269(c), Emergency Project, and 15359, Emergency. This action is necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency, and is also necessary to address a sudden and unexpected occurrence involving a clear and imminent danger, demanding immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss of, or damage to, life, health, property, or essential public services related to the COVID-19 pandemic. This permit will allow the City to implement actions needed to prevent or mitigate the adverse effects to public health, safety, and welfare related to the spread of COVID-19 by

allowing the use of public spaces for COVID-19 safety and economic recovery. Specifically, the use of these public spaces is immediately necessary to ensure that restaurant and retail uses, which are critical to the City's economy, and therefore, have the ability to provide essential services, and have sufficient physical areas to ensure social distancing to prevent or mitigate the spread of COVID-19. If additional spaces cannot be made available for these uses, social distancing would be physically constrained, and could therefore, could result in the spread of COVID-19.

Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 10 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**December 2, 2021**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2020, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

- 1. Appeals filed via E-mail: Send the appeal by email to Hearings1@sandiego.gov; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The appeal application can be obtained here. You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
- 2. Appeals filed via US Mail: Send the appeal by US Mail to City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. Appeals filed by US Mail must have a United States Postal Service (USPS) postmark by the appeal deadline to be considered valid. The appeal application can be obtained here. You must separately mail the required appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
