NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PLANNING DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME/NUMBER: Special Event Permit – San Diego Resolution Run 5K, 10K & Half Marathon

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Mission Bay Park

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 2

LOCATION: Fiesta Island and Tecolote Shores North Park

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a 5K, 10K, and half marathon event that would include the routes, vendors, food, a stage, portable restrooms, sound amplification, and the temporary use of tables, chairs, canopies and fencing and/or barriers that would occur on January 22, 2022.

Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur on January 21, 2022 from 12 PM to January 22, 2022 to 12 PM. On January 21, 2022, set-up would occur from 12 PM until 5 PM. On January 22, 2022, the event would occur from 5 AM until 11 AM, and dismantling would occur from 11 AM to 12 PM. All routes would start at Tecolote Shores North Park on E. Mission Bay Dr. and complete a clockwise loop on Fiesta Island, with the 5K and 10K returning to the starting area. The half marathon would exit Fiesta Island, turn right on pathway, u-turn near the South Shores Boat Ramp, continue north on the pathways to De Anza Cove and N. Mission Bay Dr. and u-turn back to the starting area. Full and partial road closures associated with the event would occur and would include Fiesta Island Road from 5 AM through 10 AM, De Anza Road south of N. Mission Bay Drive. N. Mission Bay Drive between the bike path and the Mission Bay 1-5 off-ramp intersection. and East Mission Bay Drive between Sea World Drive and the Mission Bay Resort from 5 AM until 10 AM.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: This action is exempt pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15269(c), Emergency Project, and 15359, Emergency. This action is necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency, and is also necessary to address a sudden and unexpected occurrence involving a clear and imminent danger, demanding immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss of, or damage to, life, health, property, or essential public services related to the COVID-19 pandemic. This permit will allow the City to implement actions needed to prevent or

mitigate the adverse effects to public health, safety, and welfare related to the spread of COVID-19 by allowing the use of public spaces for COVID-19 safety and economic recovery. Specifically, the use of these public spaces is immediately necessary to ensure that restaurant and retail uses, which are critical to the City's economy, and therefore, have the ability to provide essential services, and have sufficient physical areas to ensure social distancing to prevent or mitigate the spread of COVID-19. If additional spaces cannot be made available for these uses, social distancing would be physically constrained, and could therefore, could result in the spread of COVID-19.

CITY CONTACT:

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On January 5, 2022, the City of San Diego made the above-referenced environmental determination pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). This determination is appealable to the City Council. If you have any questions about this determination, contact the City Development Project Manager listed above.

Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 10 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**January 18, 2021**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2020, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

1. Appeals filed via E-mail: Send the appeal by email to Hearings1@sandiego.gov; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The [appeal application can be obtained here](#). You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
2. Appeals filed via US Mail: Send the appeal by US Mail to City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. Appeals filed by US Mail must have a United States Postal Service (USPS) postmark by the appeal deadline to be considered valid. The [appeal application can be obtained here](#). You must separately mail the required appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
