NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PLANNING DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME/NUMBER: Special Use Permit – Paddy’s O’Beach Party

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Ocean Beach

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 2

LOCATION: Ocean Beach Pier Parking Lot

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Use Permit for a beach party event at the Ocean Beach Pier Parking lot on March 19, 2022. The event would include the temporary use of music, sound amplification, food, a fenced-in beer garden, entertainment, vendors, games, a stage, a generator, portable restrooms, canopies, tables, and chairs. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 4 AM on March 19, 2022, until 12:30 AM on March 20, 2022. On March 19, 2022, set-up would occur from 4 AM until 10 AM, the event would occur from 10 AM until 11:30 PM and dismantling would occur from 11:30 PM until 12 AM and again on March 20, 2022 from 12 AM to 12:30 AM.

No road closures would occur with this event, however, the Ocean Beach Pier Parking Lot and Ocean Beach Lifeguard Parking Lot would be closed to public parking from 4 AM on March 19, 2022 until 12:30 AM on March 20, 2022. Public Parking would be prohibited on Abbot Street from Santa Monica Ave to Newport Street and would be reserved for ride share and loading zone areas.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: This action is exempt pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15269(c), Emergency Project, and 15359, Emergency. This action is necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency, and is also necessary to address a sudden and unexpected occurrence involving a clear and imminent danger, demanding immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss of, or damage to, life, health, property, or essential public services related to the COVID-19 pandemic. This permit will allow the City to implement actions needed to prevent or mitigate the adverse effects to public health, safety, and welfare related to the spread of COVID-19 by allowing the use of public spaces for COVID-19 safety and economic recovery. Specifically, the use of these public spaces is immediately necessary to ensure that restaurant and retail uses, which are critical to the City’s economy, and therefore, have the ability to provide essential services, and have

sufficient physical areas to ensure social distancing to prevent or mitigate the spread of COVID-19. If additional spaces cannot be made available for these uses, social distancing would be physically constrained, and could therefore, could result in the spread of COVID-19.

Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 10 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**February 18, 2022**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2020, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
2. Appeals filed via US Mail: Send the appeal by US Mail to City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. Appeals filed by US Mail must have a United States Postal Service (USPS) postmark by the appeal deadline to be considered valid. The [appeal application can be obtained here](#). You must separately mail the required appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
