NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PROJECT NAME/NUMBER: Special Event Permit – San Diego Civic Theatre Event

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Downtown

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3

LOCATION: San Diego Civic Theatre and Civic Theatre Plaza

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a theatre event that would include entertainment, and the temporary use of fencing and or barriers, that would occur at the San Diego Civic Theatre and Civic Theatre Plaza on May 4, 2022. Noise and sound amplification associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 9 AM until 11:55 PM on May 4, 2022. On May 4, 2022, set-up would occur from 9 AM until 4 PM, the event would occur from 4 PM until 10 PM, and dismantling would occur from 10 PM until 11:55 PM. Approximately 1400 attendees are anticipated throughout the course of the event.

Road closures would be associated with the event and would include 3rd Avenue between A Street and C Streets, southbound traffic, from 3 PM until 11:55 PM, and 3rd Avenue between A Street and Broadway, northbound traffic, from 8 PM until 11:55 PM on May 4, 2022. Parking closures would be associated with the event and would include 3rd Avenue between A Street and C Streets, 3rd Avenue between A Street and Broadway, and 2nd Avenue between C Street and Broadway from 4:30 AM until 11:55 PM on May 4, 2022.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: This action is exempt pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15269(c), Emergency Project, and 15359, Emergency. This action is necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency, and is also necessary to address a sudden and unexpected occurrence involving a clear and imminent danger, demanding immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss of, or damage to, life, health, property, or essential public services related to the COVID-19 pandemic. This permit will allow the City to implement actions needed to prevent or mitigate the adverse effects to public health, safety, and welfare related to the spread of COVID-19 by allowing the use of public spaces for COVID-19 safety and economic recovery. Specifically, the use of

these public spaces is immediately necessary to ensure that restaurant and retail uses, which are critical to the City's economy, and therefore, have the ability to provide essential services, and have sufficient physical areas to ensure social distancing to prevent or mitigate the spread of COVID-19. If additional spaces cannot be made available for these uses, social distancing would be physically constrained, and could therefore, could result in the spread of COVID-19.

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On April 18, 2022 the City of San Diego made the above-referenced environmental determination pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 5 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**April 25, 2022**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2020, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

- 1. Appeals filed via E-mail: Send the appeal by email to Hearings1@sandiego.gov; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The application can be obtained here. You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
- 2. Appeals filed via US Mail: Send the appeal by US Mail to City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. Appeals filed by US Mail must have a United States Postal Service (USPS) postmark by the appeal deadline to be considered valid. The appeal application can be obtained here. You must separately mail the required appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
