NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PLANNING DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME/NUMBER: Special Event Permit – 35th Navy Bay Bridge Run/Walk

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Downtown and Barrio Logan

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3 and 8

LOCATION: Hilton San Diego Bayfront Park (One Park Boulevard), Harbor Drive, Cesar E. Chavez Parkway, National Avenue in San Diego.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for the portion of the Navy Bay Bridge Run event on May 15, 2022, that would occur within the City of San Diego jurisdiction. The event would include the route, a stage, entertainment, temporary use of fencing and/or barriers, generator, tables, and chairs, portable restrooms, recycling and trash containers, to occur in the Hilton San Diego Bayfront Park. Noise associated with the event activities and setup/dismantling would occur from 2 PM on May 14, 2022 until 2 PM on May 15, 2022. Sound amplification from speakers would occur from approximately 8:30 AM until 10:30 AM on May 15, 2022. On May 14, 2022, set-up for the race start would occur from 2 PM until 7 PM, the race would occur from 5 AM until 1 PM on May 15, 2022, and the event would be dismantled from 11 AM until 2 PM in May 15, 2022. Approximately 9,500 attendees are anticipated throughout the course of the event.

Road closures would be associated with this event, would occur from 3 AM until 9 AM, and would include east and west bound traffic Park Boulevard between Harbor Drive and Convention Center Way, east and west bound traffic on Cesar E. Chavez Parkway between Harbor Drive and National Avenue, south bound traffic National Avenue between Cesar Chavez Parkway and the off-ramp to 1-5, and the west bound off-ramp to the San Diego-Coronado Bay Bridge.

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review and determined the project meets the categorical exemption criteria set forth in the CEQA State Guidelines: §Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; §Section 15304(e) (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; §Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor

structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use.

In addition, the exceptions set forth in the CEQA State Guidelines §15300.2 do not apply to this project wherein: a) the project would not impact an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped, and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; b) no cumulative impacts of successive projects of the same type in the same place were identified; c) there is no reasonable possibility that the project would have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances; d) the project would not result in damage to scenic resources, including but not limited to, trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources, within a highway officially designated as a state scenic highway; e) the project is not located on a site which is included on any list compiled pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code; and f) the project would not cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.

CITY CONTACT:

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On April 22, 2022, the City of San Diego made the above-referenced environmental determination pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 10 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**May 6, 2022**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2021, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

2. Appeals filed via US Mail: Send the appeal by US Mail to City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. Appeals filed by US Mail must have a United States Postal Service (USPS) postmark by the appeal deadline to be considered valid. The [appeal application can be obtained here](#). The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
