## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

## **SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT**

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit - Balboa Park 8 Miler

**COMMUNITY PLAN AREA:** Balboa Park

**COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3** 

LOCATION: Hall of Champions area in Balboa Park, surrounding roadways and pathways in Balboa

Park listed below

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Special Event Permit for an 8 Miler race event that would occur in Balboa Park on August 6, 2022 and would include the run route shown on the attached map, the temporary use of a stage, entertainment, generators, sound amplification, fencing and/or barriers, portable restrooms, canopies, tables, and chairs. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 2 AM until 11 AM on August 6, 20212. Set-up would occur from 2 AM until 5:30 AM, the event would occur from 5:30 AM until 9:30 AM, and dismantling would occur from 10 AM until 11 AM.

The following road closures would be associated with this event on August 6, 2022 from 6 AM to 9:30 AM: Pan America Road East from Presidents Way to El Prado, El Prado Bridge from Pan American Road East to 6<sup>th</sup> Ave, Balboa Dr from 6<sup>th</sup> Ave to Juniper Rd, Juniper Rd from 6<sup>th</sup> Ave to Balboa Dr, 8<sup>th</sup> Ave (Marston Loop) from Juniper Rd to Balboa Dr, 6<sup>th</sup> Ave from Ivy St to Upas (northbound) and Quince Drive from 6<sup>th</sup> Ave to the 163 off ramp.

On August 6, 2022 from 6 AM to 8:30 AM the following roads would be closed; Village Place from El Prado to the parking lot entrance east of Spanish Village, and Zoo Dr from in front of the zoo entrance to Park Blvd (southbound). Approximately 130 parking spaces would be closed in the Pan American Plaza Parking Lot from 2 AM to 11 AM on August 6, 2022.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

**ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

**ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee **STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for

causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 5 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (July 27, 2022). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2021, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

- 1. Appeals filed via E-mail: Send the appeal by email to Hearings1@sandiego.gov; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The appeal application can be obtained here. You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
- 2. <u>Appeals filed In-Person:</u> The appeal application can be obtained in the Lobby of the City Administration Building located at 202 'C' Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The completed appeal package must include the required appeal fee in the form of a check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101.
