REVISED NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit – 15th Annual Bike the Bay

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Downtown and Barrio Logan

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3 and 8

LOCATION: Embarcadero Marina Park South, Harbor Drive, Cesar Chavez Parkway, National Avenue

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for that portion of the Bike the Bay event that would occur within the City of San Diego's right-of-way jurisdiction on August 28, 2022. The event would include a fenced-in beer garden, and entertainment at the Embarcadero Marina Park South (port jurisdiction), tents and canopies, tables and chairs, a beer garden, performances, sound amplification, portable restrooms and recycle and trash containers and bicycling on city roadways. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 9 AM on August 27, 2022, until 3 PM on August 28, 2022. Set-up would occur from 9 AM until 3 PM on August 27, 2022, the event would occur on August 28, 2022 from 6 AM until 2 PM, and dismantling would occur from 12 PM until 3 PM. The number of attendees anticipated would be approximately 2500. The portion of the cycling event that would occur on city roadways and right of way would include Convention Way, Park Boulevard, Harbor Drive, Cesar Chavez Parkway, Sigsbee St, and National Avenue and Otay Valley Regional Park trails (see attached maps).

Road closures associated with this event would be on August 28, 2022 from 6 AM to 1 PM and include Harbor Drive from Park Boulevard to Cesar Chavez (northbound and southbound) and on Cesar Chavez from Harbor Drive to National Ave (eastbound).

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.


- 1. <u>Appeals filed via E-mail</u>: Send the appeal by email to <u>Hearings1@sandiego.gov</u>; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The <u>appeal application can be obtained here</u>. You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: **City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101**. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
- 2. <u>Appeals filed In-Person:</u> The appeal application can be obtained in the Lobby of the City Administration Building located at 202 'C' Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The completed appeal package must include the required appeal fee in the form of a check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101.
