NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit- Aloha Run

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Mission Bay Park Master Plan

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 2

LOCATION: Tecolote Shores South Park, pathways within Mission Bay Park, North Mission Bay

Drive, De Anza Road

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a 10K/5K run event that would include the routes, vendor expo, a stage, generators, entertainment, music, sound amplification, and the temporary use of portable restrooms, canopies, fencing and/or barriers, onsite food preparation, tables, and chairs on September 11, 2022. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 9 AM on September 10, 2022, to 2 PM on September 11, 2022. Set-up would occur from 9 AM until 6 PM on September 10, 2021, the event would occur from 5:00 AM until 12 PM on September 11, 2022, and dismantling would occur from 12 PM until 2 PM on September 11, 2022. The run/walk routes for both the 5K and 10K are shown on the attached map.

The following road closures including parking closures on September 11, 2022 would be as follows: on De Anza Road (northbound) from Bayside Walk to North Mission Bay Drive from 6:45 AM to 8 AM, on North Mission Bay Drive (westbound) from De Anza Road to the pedestrian Bridge to Mission High School from 6:45 AM to 9 AM.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for

causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 10 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**August 26, 2022**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2021, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

- 1. Appeals filed via E-mail: Send the appeal by email to Hearings1@sandiego.gov; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The appeal application can be obtained here. You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
- 2. <u>Appeals filed In-Person:</u> The appeal application can be obtained in the Lobby of the City Administration Building located at 202 'C' Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The completed appeal package must include the required appeal fee in the form of a check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101.


