

Date of Notice: August 24, 2022 NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit- Mission Bay Festival
COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Mission Bay Park
COUNCIL DISTRICT: 2
LOCATION: Mariner's Point Park, 3119 Mariners Way and Bonita Cove

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a Mission Bay Festival that would occur within Mariners Point Park on September 24, 2022. The event would include music, performances, sound amplification, generators, a stage, tables, chairs, canopies, bleaches, alcohol, fencing and/or barriers, onsite food preparation, drones, portable restrooms, and recycle and trash containers. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from September 22, 2022 at 4 AM to September 26, 2022 at 10 AM. Set-up would occur over three days; on September 22, 2022 from 4 AM to 10 PM, September 23, 2022 from 4 AM to 10 PM, September 24, 2022 from 4 AM to 2 PM. The event would occur on September 24, 2022 from 2 PM to 10 PM. Dismantling would occur over three days; on September 24, 2022 from 10 PM to 11:55 PM, September 25, 2022 from 12 AM to 10 PM, September 26, 2022 from 12 AM to 10 AM.

Mariner's Way would be closed from West Mission Bay Drive to Mariner's Point on the following dates: September 22, 23, 24, and 25, 2022 each day from 4 AM to 10 PM; and September 26, 2022 from 4 AM to 10 AM. Approximately 350 parking spaces within Bonita Cove Parking Lot East would be closed from September 22, 2022 at 4 AM through September 26, 2022 at 10 AM.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego

conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2021, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

- <u>Appeals filed via E-mail</u>: Send the appeal by email to <u>Hearings1@sandiego.gov</u>; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The <u>appeal application can be obtained here</u>. You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
- 2. <u>Appeals filed In-Person:</u> The appeal application can be obtained in the Lobby of the City Administration Building located at 202 'C' Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The completed appeal package must include the required appeal fee in the form of a check payable to the City Treasurer to: **City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101.**
