NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit – San Diego Triathlon Challenge

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: La Jolla, Mission Bay Park, Mission Beach, Pacific Beach, Peninsula, Ocean Beach

LOCATION: Bonita Cove, Ventura Cove, and surrounding pathways/roadways from La Jolla to Ocean Beach (see attached maps)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a triathlon and festival event that would include the a celebratory dinner event, swimming events, bicycling events, wheelchair/running events, portable restrooms, tables, chairs, bleachers, canopies, fencing and/or barriers, drones, on site food preparation, vendor booths, inflatables, kids' zone, stages and entertainment, sound amplification, generators, that would on October 21 & 23, 2022 (see attached maps for swimming, biking and running routes). Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 7 AM on October 21, 2022, until 12 PM on October 24, 2021. Set-up would occur October 21 & 22, 2022 from 7 AM to 7 PM and October 23, 2022 from 4 AM to 4 PM, the event would occur on October 21, 2022 from 8 AM to 5 PM and on October 23, 2022 from 6 AM to 4 PM. Dismantling would occur on October 23, 2022 from 4 PM to 8 PM and on October 24, 2022 from 7 AM to 12 PM.

Road closures associated with this event would include Mariners Way from the entrance to the park to the end of the park, eastbound direction from October 21, 2022 at 7 AM to October 24, 2022 at 7 AM, and an eastbound lane closure on West Mission Bay Drive from Gleason Road to Quivira Road on October 23, 2022 from 7:30 AM to 1:30 PM. Approximately 120 parking spaces in Bonita Cove East parking lot would be closed from October 21, 2022 at 7 AM to October 24, 2022 at 7 AM.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

On October 10, 2022, the City of San Diego made the above-referenced environmental determination pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). This determination is appealable to the City Council. If you have any questions about this determination, contact the City Contact listed above.

Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 10 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**October 21, 2022**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2021, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

1. Appeals filed via E-mail: Send the appeal by email to Hearings1@sandiego.gov; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The [appeal application can be obtained here](#). You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: **City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101**. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
2. Appeals filed In-Person: The appeal application can be obtained in the Lobby of the City Administration Building located at 202 'C' Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The completed appeal package must include the required appeal fee in the form of a check payable to the City Treasurer to: **City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101**.

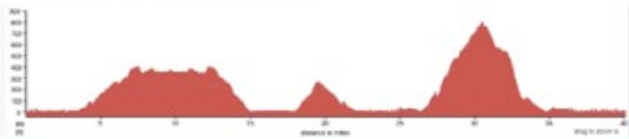
