NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit – Nightmare on Normal Street

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Uptown

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3

LOCATION: Normal Street between University Avenue and Harvey Milk Street

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for an outdoor, over 21, night time dance party and costume competition would occur on Normal Street between University Avenue and Harvey Milk Street on October 29, 2022 (see attached map). The event would include music, a stage, entertainment, sound amplification, generators, canopies, fences and/or barriers, tables and chairs, alcoholic beverages, onsite food preparation, food trucks, food vendors, arts and crafts vendors, portable restrooms and recycling and trash containers. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 4 AM on October 29, 2022 until 1:30 AM on October 30, 2022. Set-up would occur on October 29, 2022 from 4 AM to 11 AM, the event would occur from 11 AM to 11:30 PM and dismantling would occur from 11:30 PM to 12 AM and continue on October 30, 2022 from 12 AM to 1:30 AM.

A road closure would be associated with the event and would include Normal Street between University Avenue and Harvey Milk Street from 4 AM on October 29, 2022, until 2 AM on October 30, 2022. Parking would also be removed from 4 AM on October 29, 2022 through October 30, 2022 at 2 AM on Harvey Milk St from Centre St to Cleveland Avenue.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego

conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 5 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**October 11, 2022**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2021, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

- Appeals filed via E-mail: Send the appeal by email to Hearings1@sandiego.gov; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The appeal application can be obtained here. You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
- 2. <u>Appeals filed In-Person:</u> The appeal application can be obtained in the Lobby of the City Administration Building located at 202 'C' Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The completed appeal package must include the required appeal fee in the form of a check payable to the City Treasurer to: City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101.
